At Vina Chattin we haven't assessed for the month of December yet on ISIP or STAR math. This week is a busy week, full of assessments. On December 5th we will ISIP test during ELA small group time. On December 6th we will assess for STAR math during math block. All students are assessing in their classroom on chromebooks for both ISIP and STAR math. 1st grade has also

finished Unit 2 in the Wonders Program and will be unit testing on Wednesday and Thursday during small group time. The teachers do some of the unit assessment full group and then differentiates for the other part of the assessment based on students reading abilities.

The teachers will use this data to look at small group instruction and plan their instruction to meet the needs of the students.

School Counselor

November has been a very busy month and I don't know where the time went. With the cold weather here we have been busy stocking our clothing closet with warm weather gear for the students. We have received donations from the Blackfeet Boxing Club, Blackfeet Tribe, Partnership with Native Americans, Blackfeet at HEART/Susan Fletcher, Whitefish area donors and individual donors from the Blackfeet community. We have reached out to other organizations and private donors such as Patagonia and are awaiting donations promised.

I began groups for the First Grade classes and the groups will focus on Culture and Identity. I chose these topics because many of our Blackfeet Cultural Values and "who we are as Indigenous People" have teachings of how children are Sacred and how to respect themselves/others. Knowing who they are as Amskaapii Pikuni, will give them a sense of identity and pride which will enhance their self-esteem and self-worth. My first lesson was on being an Indian, Blackfeet Indian, Pikuni or Amskaapii Pikuni. I introduced the Blackfeet flag and the student's seemed to be proud that the "blue flag with feathers" in their classrooms actually is theirs' and now has personal meaning for them. I am looking forward to my next lesson and creating my own Culture and Identity curriculum to use in these lessons.

I continue to meet with individual students, teachers and parents making several phone calls to check on students, contacting parents/guardians as well as contacting various organizations for student services. We have had 13 Solutions Meetings and 6 home-visits.

The morning Meet and Greet continues to be a favorite of mine as I get to greet both the students and parents/guardians in the mornings. It's a great time to check in with students and their parents and for them to communicate with us as well. The parents/guardians continually appreciate and thank us for being outside to open car doors and greet students especially now that the weather is colder.

I have attended 8 home visits due to attendance. I updated the Kindergarten court referral list since some students attendance improved and one moved to another district. So far, 2 kindergarten families were referred to the courts for their students poor attendance. I will continue making phone calls and home visits to improve our attendance. I have brought one student to dental this week and am currently waiting for appointments for 2 others. We had 21 families utilize our parent center in November and 22 utilize the clothing closet.

I've applied for and received items for the pre-kindergarten classes through the Native Partnership Literacy Program. Native Partnership sent both adult and student incentives as a reward for families reading together. I have since then setup a mini library in the parent center for students and their families to check out books to read, many families have utilized the library. For the students who did not read at home, the teachers read with them so they could also receive incentives. I also requested Tom's snow boots from Native Partnership and we received a load of

snow boots, shoes, and socks, which will be distributed to our students. I will also be applying for their Easter egg hunt program and their school supplies program. Native Partnership has also sent incentives for individuals that attend the parenting class.

The first week of December I will be attending the Sacred Father, Sacred Mother, parenting class training in Havre, Mt. Once I finish the training I will be offering parenting classes at KW Bergan. We also held the board meeting in our parent center this month, which turned out very good. We recognized staff members and students with perfect attendance.

I would like to thank our generous community members who have donated to our clothing closet: Jace Racine, Charlotte Cadotte, Sherie Blue, Methodist Church in Columbia Falls, Tribal Planning Department, Frank Kipp and the boxing club, Nikki Hannon (FIT Program), and Native Partnership.
