Once we decide what those critical skills are, we will create experiences for kids from pre-K all the way through middle school that support students in learning and practicing those skills.












# Portrait Feedback: Sorting by Dimension and Analyzing for Themes



We started with a draft Portrait that reflected key feedback from affinity groups and was expanded by our teacher design team to include learning goals and standards across all grade levels.

Thanks to community participation, we have hundreds of data points across all of our draft dimensions. Our next step is to review the data, sort it into themes and come up with key patterns or takeaways for each dimension.

District leaders and the teacher design team will meet at the end of April to review takeaways and develop final recommendations for the next version of the Portrait.
