24447 Public Hearing on Financial Accountability

Public Hearing on 2017-2018 FIRST (Financial Integrity Rating System of Texas): Chief Financial Officer David Harwell presented this item for discussion. The First report is based on the previous year. ECISD scored an 80 (B = Above Standard) for the 2016-2017 school year. ECISD met all fifteen indicators, however scored less than 10 points on three indicators – two of them were low assets to liabilities ratios and the third was the operating loss in the general fund. Report on Curriculum & Instruction Plans, Improvement Required (IR)

Campuses, and Interim Assessments (Goal 1 – Inputs/Outputs GPM 1.3 & 1.5): Associate Superintendent of Curriculum & Instruction Dr. Lilia Náñez, Executive Director of Assessment & Accountability Annette Macias, and Director of Literacy Jaime Miller provided and reviewed the scale scores from this fall's Interim Assessments for all campuses with the Board of Trustees. These Interim Assessments are developed by the Texas Education Agency, and are offered online. Elementary schools administered the interim assessment in October and Middle schools in November. This round of interim assessments provides a baseline for students. A second administration will take place in February, which will show teachers if students are making necessary growth. Having these TEA assessments in place will also allow schools to compare individual students' progress from year to year. Trustees were also provided with updates on reading scores.

24454 Presentation of Board of Trustees' Continuing Education Report and Review of New Requirements and Reporting Timeline: Deputy Superintendent Dr. Stephanie Howard presented this item for discussion. The State Legislature requires school Districts to provide the public with a record of school board member continuing education credit hours. Recent amendments to the Texas Education Code are changing the way school boards report the hours of continuing education credit earned by school board members. Under prior law, boards announced continuing education credits at the end of the calendar year. Under new law, the time for credit reporting will depend on when the district holds trustee elections. Announcements will be made at the last regular board meeting before trustee elections. ECISD holds May elections, therefore will announce in April. The change is intended to synchronize the time of the report with the time of year when credits are actually due to be completed, as most board members are elected, and the state rules give board members one year to earn the require credit.
