STAFF DEVELOPMENT RECOMMENDATION

TITLE OF TRAINING:

STAAR Scored Student Compositions: Hands-On Experience / Aligning Depth of Knowledge with the TEKS and STAAR

DESCRIPTION:

This workshop is aimed to train teachers meet student writing success. They will explore the pivotal components of the STAAR scoring process in order to make instructional decisions that will improve student achievement. Teachers will gain knowledge of the STAAR writing design, STAAR writing rubric and the process for scoring student expository writing.

FEES:

TRI-LIN

TRI-LIN provides support services such as: facilitation of content review, standard setting, data review, alignment study meetings, and preparation of ancillary documents like test administration manuals.

Their expertise will help our English teachers to analyze, align, and develop quality lessons. These lessons will help our students be successful in their writing assignments. Day one of the training will focus on writing rubrics and data. Day two will consist of aligning writing objectives to instruction and planning.
