These certifications must be ratified by an LEA's board of trustees or governing body in an open public, noticed meeting.

## **Background Information:**

The Certification of the Provision of Instructional Materials is an annual required process formerly known as the TEKS Certification Process. Districts and open-enrollment charter schools will be unable to order instructional materials through the EMAT system (Education Materials System) until the certification has been ratified by the local School Board at an open meeting, and the signed certification is then submitted and received by the Texas Education Agency (TEA).
