Since 1970, the Illinois State Board of Education has sponsored the Those Who Excel & Teacher of the Year program to honor educators who have made significant contributions to our state's public and nonpublic elementary and secondary schools. Awards are presented in seven categories: classroom teachers, early career educators (teachers 1-4 years), school administrators, student support personnel, educational service personnel, community volunteers, and teams. Application materials are evaluated by a selection committee composed of individuals who represent a variety of educational organizations. All awardees are honored at an annual banquet in the Spring.

Euclid's Multilingual team members work seamlessly across three different teams: their own team, their grade-level teaching team, and a 5th-grade partner teacher. With a relentless commitment to meeting the needs of their ML students, they use data to plan small group lessons, co-plan co-taught lessons, consult with partner teachers, and collaborate to address the unique challenges faced by individual learners—particularly the growing number of newcomers. Their hard work paid off last school year, with 31% of our ML students exiting the program on ACCESS, compared to the district's exit rate of 18%. We are deeply grateful for their leadership, expertise, and collaboration.
