

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STAAR/EOC Assessment Calendar Process

- Coordinator for Assessment and Accountability contacts principals and CTS for desired STAAR/EOC testing dates
- Coordinator for Assessment and Accountability then provides those dates to the Chief Learning Officer for final approval
- Dates are then placed on the internal testing calendar

Multiple Measures of Assessment

- Spring Semester- Testing calendar is created
 - <u>2024-2025 Testing Calendar</u>
 - MCLASS, CLI, NWEA MAP, TELPAS, PSAT, AP exams, (TSIA2 25-26 calendar)

These dates are determined by the Teaching and Learning Department with feedback from coaches and principals. These dates are also subject to shift based on campus/district need.
