2012 Local Education Agency Compliance Report Department of Special Education

Prepared for Board of Trustees Meeting December 11, 2012

Purpose of Report

To inform the Board of the District's special education compliance status associated with indicators 11, 12 and 13 in the State Performance Plan (SPP).

Board Goal

II. Teaching & Learning. . . In pursuit of excellence, the district will advocate and practice true accountability based on measurement of individual student progress over time, regardless of external mandates.

History

Annually the Texas Education Agency informs the district of its status related to special education compliance for State Performance Plan (SPP) indicators 11, 12 and 13. Each year, no later than August 31, the district electronically submits data associated with these three indicators to the TEA. The Agency reviews the data submission to determine the special education compliance status of these three indicators. Data submitted from 2009 through 2011 for SPP indicators 11, 12 and 13 resulted in non-compliance status for the district. During the past few years, the Department of Special Education leadership began creating systems and implementing activities to move the district to a compliance status. Below is the compliance status for the years 2009-2010, 2010-2011 and 2011-2012.

Activities to Maintain State Performance Plan Compliance Status

The Executive Director of Special Education and Special Education Supervisors will continue to review reports regularly and meet with evaluation staff to ensure timelines are met for SPP indicators 11, 12 and 13. The Executive Director will meet with the Special Education Support Staff to review the compliance status as well as the requirements and their involvement in maintaining the compliant status. The Special Education Secondary Coordinator and the evaluation supervisors will continue to provide training and guidance to ensure continued compliance with the SPP 13 components. Additionally, she will meet regularly with the transition teachers from each traditional secondary campus to ensure all component of SPP 13 are met. As in the past, beginning in January they will begin random sample folder reviews to review compliance status for the components of SPP 13. Finally, each grading period the campus special education evaluation staff will provide campus administrators with a list of outstanding referrals. Reports will include deadline for evaluation as well as timeline for ARD meeting.
