Grade Weighting

Graduating classes of 2018

For purpose of computing a student's high school grade-point average the following point system will be used:

A = 4.0 B = 3.0 C = 2.0 D = 1.0 F = 0

Advanced placement courses will have grades weighted in the following manner:

A = 5.0B = 4.0C = 3.0D = 2.0F = 0

Grades for dual credit courses will be weighted in the following manner:

A = 4.0 B = 3.0 C = 2.0 D = 1.0 F = 0

Beginning Fall 2019 and beyond:

For purpose of computing a student's high school grade-point average the following point system will be used:

A = 4.0 B = 3.0 C = 2.0 D = 1.0 F = 0

Advanced Placement courses will have grades weighted in the following manner:

A = 5.0 B = 4.0 C = 3.0 D = 2.0 F = 0

Beginning with the graduating class of 2022, Advanced Placement courses and dual credit courses with advanced placement equivalents or greater will have grades weighted in the following manner:

A = 5.0 B = 4.0 C = 3.0 D = 2.0F = 0

Beginning Summer 2025 and beyond dual credit courses will have grades weighted in the following manner:

A = 5.0 B = 4.0 C = 3.0 D = 2.0 F = 0.0

Eligibility of courses for a weighted grade:

Course eligibility will be determined using the following guidelines:

• The course is determined equivalent to the high school Advanced Placement course and is included in the post secondary institutions published list as such.

• Pre-AP classes will have an honors designation. Honors classes will be a 4.0 grade scale. Students transferring into the District will have their honors classes transcribed at a 4.0 grading scale.

Class rank shall be determined as follows:

• Class ranking will be determined each semester beginning with the first (1st) semester of the ninth (9th) grade.

• Class rank will be based only on the grades earned in classes that meet or exceed graduation requirements.

College courses 1110 and above will be a 5.0 grade scale.

• Total grade points begin accumulating with the ninth (9th) grade. These are divided by total units attempted to produce the accumulative grade point average. Students are then ranked according to grade point average. Algebra and Health taken at the eighth grade will be included.
