

Public Education Grant (PEG)

Q. What is the PEG program?

A. In 1995, the Texas Legislature created the Public Education Grant (PEG) program. The PEG program permits parents whose children attend schools on the PEG list to request that their children transfer to schools in other districts. A list of PEG-designated schools is provided to districts annually. By February 1, districts must notify each parent of a student in the district assigned to attend a school on the PEG list. Based on the February list, parents may request a transfer for the following school year. (For example, the list provided to parents by February 1, 2014 allows for transfer requests for the 2014-2015 school year.)

Q. Why does a school appear on the PEG list?

A. Included on the PEG list are 2014 campuses with passing rates on STAAR that are less than or equal to 50% in any two of the preceding three years: 2012, 2013, 2014 or the school was rated Improvement Required in 2013 or 2014.
