













## **Indigenous Computer Science Research Study**

The study objectives are to:

- 1. Engage the Tribal Communities and Schools or Community-Based Programs in the research as partners and collaborators and gain their input on the research protocols for research.
- 2. Conduct Talk Story dialogues with Native youth, college student family members, educators, Elders, knowledge holders, and Tribal leadership by FY 2025.
- 3. Develop a narrative report in consultation and collaboration with the Tribal Points of Contacts (TPOCs) and School or Community-based program partners to co-construct meaning-making of the findings, and develop shared goals for informing the community about the findings. Possible data uses include: informing strategic planning, policy, and resource development for CS education with the selected sites, the research coalition, and the broader CS education; improve CS access, exposure, learning, and career opportunities for Indigenous youth and communities.

Closing-out the study upon completion of the data collection period including:

- identifying additional protocols for the protection and archiving of the data
- discussing next steps/opportunities through the study's coalition partners.
- determining additional permissions and authorship needed (beyond consent forms)
