## 2023-24 School Focus

We continue to stay focused on our four focuses with the goal of refining our action steps to meet these focuses. These are:

- 1. Science of Reading
- 2. Science of Writing/Handwriting
- 3. Math plan following Mary Buck's guidance
- 4. Social Emotional Learning with Conscious Discipline & DESSA

### Science of Reading

We have been steadily focusing on strengthening our Tier 1 core instruction to ensure that every student is receiving effective, differentiated Tier I core literacy instruction from high-quality research-based curricula and instructional strategies that are aligned to the Common Core State Standards.

In addition, there are students who need additional intervention support to catch them up. Fall screening data indicated that there were students that needed additional diagnostic assessments to determine what foundational skills they have mastered and what they need instructionally. This month we focused strongly on implementing our intervention block. Intervention is additional instruction provided to students that is designed to meet their specific needs while at the same time accelerating their growth toward grade-level benchmarks.

## Science of Writing

Research shows that students' writing improves when students improve their handwriting. Based on walkthroughs in classrooms it has been observed that many of our students are struggling to correctly form their letters and space their words. To address this need, handwriting materials from Handwriting Without Tears were ordered for students and teachers. Training was offered to BES

# Instructional Coaches Report by Arlene

We have been working on our walk to read - SIPPS daily reading intervention that is now off in full swing. Over the past few weeks we have been supporting teachers and specials teachers during Friday grade level meetings with PD covering:

- How to administe r Aimsweb survey level assessment
- How to set student Aimsweb progress monitor schedule of reading goals
- How to prepare for their PDSA cycles for 2nd qtr.

Also we have been supporting teachers with PD on SIPPS routines and pacing.

We continue to support tier 1 instruction to follow our literacy plan using Wonders which supports the upper half of Scarborough's reading rope for language comprehension.

Our instructional consultant Teresa Owens came to offer guidance for PD's which resulted in creating a coaches calendar. Our next steps include PD for Error Correction Procedure that is universal for all curriculum. Her guidance and support has helped supp ort our routines, pacing, and opportunities to respond.

School's Cubed visited in early October to see that our tier 1 instruction is in place by doing walkthroughs and further assisting with training new teachers with SIPPS Extension intervention. Our interventionist and instructional TA were given Sound Partners training to support their WIN group.

Our Math consultant Mary Buck came to support our Eureka math implementation plan by doing walkthroughs and support for routines, pacing, and opportunities t o respond. Continuing with bringing back around the foundation of math fluency daily to support student number sense.

## Counselor Report by Dana Sure Chief

The counseling program has assisted with BES home visits, weekend food distribution for the 2nd and 3rd grade, completed In Person contacts and Parent Phone calls, attended Solutions Meeting, provided Counseling with individual meetings, and assisted with weekly Grief Support Group. Additionally, students have been referred for support services through school and community resources.
