#### Ms. H's Counseling Corner

I hope everyone had a fun and relaxing spring break! Whether you traveled, played outside, read a great book, or spent time with family and friends, I'm so excited you are back at school and ready for more learning and adventures.



We will be finishing up our bully prevention lessons during the month of April. Students have been learning about how to <u>Recognize</u> bullying, <u>Report</u> it to an adult, and then <u>Respond</u> with our words to make it stop. These are the three R's that we have been practicing throughout this year. It takes courage to stand up to bullying and that is why the characteristic for the month of April is Courage.

Courage is an important part of growing up, and it isn't just about doing something big or scary. It is also about standing up for what is right, even when it's hard. It takes courage to use our Tools when others are not using theirs. With the Courage Tool, students are encouraged to put together all the things they learned from using the other Tools in their Toolbox, and follow their hearts to do what they know is right. It means being kind to someone who needs a friend, asking for help when you don't understand something, or trying something new even if you're a little nervous. It's about being brave everyday in small and sometimes big ways.



So as we finish up our bully prevention lessons we will be looking at how to be an "upstander." This means speaking up for others when they see something wrong, helping a friend who is being left out, telling an adult when someone is being bullied, or simply saying kind words to someone who needs support. Being an "upstander" is important because it helps make sure that everyone

feels safe, included and valued. When we choose to help instead of looking the other way, we show courage and kindness!

During the month of March, K-5 students worked on basketball skills. 
# HOW TO APPLY

# **From our District Nurse**

We are encouraging students to keep their hands away from their face and to **wash their hands often.** Good hand washing is the number one prevention effort for transmission of germs. Washing hands before meals, after using the bathroom, after blowing their nose and whenever hands are visibly dirty all help keep students healthy. The school is making an effort to encourage this at school and we appreciate if you can also remind them of the same at home. Take care & stay healthy!

#### Reasons to keep me home from school and what needs to happen before I can return

What is my symptom?	When should I stay home?	When can I return to school?
Fever	I have had a fever of 100.4°F (38°C) or higher in the last 24 hours.	If I have been fever-free for 24 hours without the use of fever-reducing medication and I am feeling better.
Vomiting or diarrhea	If I have vomited 2 or more times in the last 24 hours. If I have had 3 loose or watery stools in a day or if I may not make it to the toilet in time.	If I did not vomit in the last 24 hours and am able to drink liquids and eat food. If I have not had diarrhea in the last 24 hours.
New cough or trouble breathing	If I have a new or persistent cough that interferes with my ability to participate in school activities, difficulty breathing or trouble catching my breath.	Once I am feeling better and my symptoms are improving for at least 24 hours. If my symptoms were due to asthma, please make sure that I have permission to use a rescue inhaler at school.
Rash	If the rash is new and undiagnosed by a health-care provider, is increasing in size, is draining and cannot be completely covered, or if I develop a fever.	If my rash has healed or I have been cleared for return by my health-care provider and any draining rashes are completely covered.
Eye redness and drainage	If I have new and unexplained eye redness without drainage, fever, eye pain, eyelid redness or vision changes.	Once my eye symptoms have gone away or I have been cleared for return by my health-care provider.

If you don't know whether to send your child to school or have specific concerns regarding your child's health, contact your child's health-care provider, a local healthcare provider, or the school nurse.

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





