Hazard Mitigation Plan Adoption

Wilson County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Action Plan

- Purpose: Address risks posed by natural hazards to people and property within LVISD.
- Background:
 - Wilson County developed a multi-hazard mitigation plan per the Disaster Mitigation Act of 2000.
 - The plan outlines long-term risk reduction strategies for communities, including school districts.
- **Commitment:** LVISD demonstrates support for community safety and proactive hazard mitigation.
- Action: LVISD formally adopts the Wilson County 2025 Hazard Mitigation Action Plan.
- Flexibility:
 - Plan may be edited or amended after submission.
 - Re-adoption is not required for future iterations of this plan.

Goal: Minimize or eliminate long-term risk to life and property from natural hazards through effective, sustainable mitigation strategies.

FEMA Compliance & Funding:

- FEMA-approved plan is **required** for eligibility under Hazard Mitigation Assistance (HMA) programs:
 - HMGP (Hazard Mitigation Grant Program)
 - FMA (Flood Mitigation Assistance)
 - HHPD (High Hazard Potential Dams)
- Eligible jurisdictions can receive **grant funds** for projects identified in the Plan Update.

Project Planning & Implementation Flexibility

Mitigation Projects:

- Projects are community-identified ideas to reduce hazard impact.
- Implementation depends on fund availability and local priorities.

Flexibility & Requirements:

- No penalty if actions are not implemented during the 5-year plan cycle.
- Projects can be deferred to the next update (targeted for 2030).
- Estimated costs must be included, but final costs are flexible if pursuing FEMA funding.
