Washington Water Main Break

 The water main busted from the front stairs of the building, which is partly City work, but mostly District expense. Hilton's and the City temporarily patched the busted pipe, but the permanent work will be completed over Easter break. Castle Concrete will also be repairing the front steps on the boulevard that had to be opened up to get to the leak. A <u>rough</u> estimate of the cost to repair the pipe leading into the school, plus the concrete work is about \$10,000.

Church Sign Damaged

 As Dr. Lett reported to you earlier, one of our new drivers was practicing in a church parking lot and backed into the brick sign. There was extensive damage to the sign (not to the bus), and I am currently waiting for two estimates from area contractors. The sign is illuminated within the brick framework, so I'm sure this will be an insurance claim.
