center and GED placements. . Mr. Farmer is working with all juniors, sophomores and testing


(PSAT, OAKS, SAT, ACT and AP). Counseling is available Monday through Friday. Please call to

Financial aid decisions are often made early and the OOG (Oregon Opportunity Grant) will run out by February 1, 2012. Also many schools have application dead-

lines that are early. Some are as early as November 15, 2011. Please check with the school you plan to attend.

It is your responsibility to know how many credits you have on your transcript. Do you have enough credits to graduate? <u>Do you have the</u> <u>right credits? Do you need to</u> make up credits? Will you be able to complete on time with your class? Begin to make plans now. What will you do after graduation? Please see Ms. Lieser or Mr. Farmer if you have any questions about your situation. We will be carrying out at least two community service projects per year, including one that furthers international understanding and goodwill.


We have over 250,000 members in more than 110 countries. Meet new people from your own school and community who are interested in making the world a better place. Make a difference in your future...Make a difference in the world.






HVHS Career Center/Room B-1

Incentive and Support

System

Positive Behavior Incentive and Support System (PBIS)

Hidden Valley High School is continuing, along with all other Three Rivers School District schools, in supporting the Positive Behavior Incentive and Support System (PBIS). PBIS is a program based on teaching behavior expectations, rewarding students for displaying appropriate behavior and providing interventions to students who are having difficulties with behavior. The PBIS model establishes three tiers of behavior; green zone (0 to 1 office behavior referrals), yellow zone (2 to 5 referrals) and red zone (6 or more referrals). The model also suggests that 80% of students should be in the green zone; 15% in the yellow zone, and 5% in the red zone.

Past efforts of the PBIS team have paid off at HVHS. Based on last years referral data, HVHS students are definitely practicing PBIS with 90% in the green, 8% in yellow and only 2% of students in the red zone.

One change for the 2011 – 2012 school year is changing the HVHS PBIS from the more elementary and middle school *Be Safe; Be Respectful; Be Responsible* to *Mustang P.R.I.D.E.* P stands for Perseverance, R for Respect, I for Integrity, D for Diversity and E for Excellence.

Our staff is continuing to recognize appropriate behavior and have established several incentive programs. Teachers send home Mustang Grams to parents of students who are showing improvement or outstanding behavior in classrooms and academics. When staff witnesses students who go "above and beyond" expectations, they issue Mustang Bucks to the student. These are turned into the office and the student's name is entered in drawings for prizes. With reduction in staff, HVHS's PBIS team is seeking new staff members and more incentives are being discussed and may include field trips, assemblies and special events for green zone kids.

NEW CLUB Forming at HVHS

October 6th was the first organizational meeting of a proposed new club at Hidden Valley High School. Twelve students attended and discussed the purpose of a Car Club. Because HVHS does not have an automotive program Ms. Dickens-Turk brought the idea to the student body. Her husband, Tom Turk, has volunteered to be the advisor if the club is approved. Kim Roeser has also ex-



pressed interest in assisting as an advisor.

Last year, Mr. Turk found an ad on Craig's List for a 1989 Mustang LX 5.0 where the owner was looking to donate this vehicle to a school. He remembered the impact auto shop had on him in high school and wanted to "pay forward" what he had gained to other students. Jim Bell from Portland, Oregon had received offers to buy his car, but donating to a high school was his only motivation.

The next step for the Car Club is to present their proposal to the HVHS Student Government for approval. Members in the proposed club want to have an avenue to learn simple car maintenance, to work on their own vehicles, to host car shows and to maintain the 1989 Mustang LX They will locate 5.0 vehicle. sponsors and fundraise to obtain funds for the club. Members will also establish a positive image of Hidden Valley High School, hopefully getting approval to eventually compete in races against other schools and drivers in guarter mile drag races at Champion Speedway in White City. They would learn and apply drag strip rules and regulations and practice safe driving skills.





2011 Art Along The Rogue

HVHS had 13 student artists show up on Saturday morning October 1st to help create not only a great piece of street art but to make an exceptional team.
