




STAAR: All Grades, All Subjects






STAAR: All Grades, ELA/Reading






STAAR: All Grades, Math






STAAR: All Grades, Science








STAAR: Annual Growth





- > Anonymous reporting tools for staff, students, and parents
- CrisisGo Silent Panic Alert Technology allows all staff, including substitutes, to notify the entire campus of a threat of violence instantly
- Campus-based positive behavior supports
- Staff and student training on bullying and violence prevention and recognizing the potential signs of violence
