 Paraprofessionals including Praxis Test Prep and content areas such as ED194-Parapros Assisting with Literacy (SP23)
- Praxis Testing offered at Ilisagvik College for better access and lower costs
- Transitional support for A.A. graduates who want to transfer to 4-year institutions
- Continue to build out the concentrations for Elementary Education and Language & Culture
- On-going Community Workshops providing materials & activity information to parents focusing on Early Childhood & Elementary STEM.
