

East Aurora Extension Campus School Improvement Plan March 17, 2025

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2023-2024 Summary - Highlights

During the 2023-2024 school year:

- 28 EAEC students graduated in the Class of 2024
- 54% of students met or exceeded their growth target in MATH as measured by NWEA MAP
- 9% reduction in students receiving multiple behavioral referrals
- 7 EAEC students successfully transitioned back to their home school
- Average Daily Attendance for the 23-24 school year was 73.33%

Goal # 1 Educational Equity

By the end of the 2024-2025 school year, 60% of EAEC EL students will meet or exceed their expected growth target in Reading and Math as measured by the NWEA MAP assessment.

- Teachers analyze student data to identify specific learning needs
- Students engage in goal setting as part of their learning process
- Data conversations during PLC to assess and identify efficacy and efficiency of reading and mathematical learning strategies
- Incentives provided for students meeting / exceeding expected growth



Goal # 2 Operational Excellence

East Aurora Extension Campus will maintain a cumulative monthly average daily attendance rate of 75% for the 2024-2025 school year.

- Daily calls to parents by parent liaison
- SLT compares year to date attendance data at each meeting
- Administration pulls weekly attendance reports to monitor student attendance and determine appropriate steps / interventions
- ROE truancy referrals made for chronically truant students
- Administrators provide incentives for students with improved attendance

COLLABORATIVE LEADERSHIP Engage in continuous improvements through celliborative, student-flocused, and data-driven leadership.

Goal # 3 Collaborative Leadership

By the end of the first semester of the 2024-2025 school year, high school students will reduce course grades of "D" and "F" by 5% as compared to our student's most recent semester spent at EAHS or another high school.

- Weekly analysis of student grades in their individual courses
- Teacher student- administration meetings regarding student grades
- Implement student action plans to improve course grades
- Incentives provided for improving individual course grades

Goal # 4 Student Achievement



EAEC high school students will gain at least 1 more credit during the first semester of the 2024-2025 school year, as compared to the credits our students gained during their most recent semesters spent at EAHS or another high school.

- Goal setting meetings held with high school students to establish semester and yearly goals
- Weekly analysis of student grades and progress towards course completion
- Parent- student- administration meetings regarding academic progress
- Incentives provided for credit acquisition
