We had a great year as a Title I team, building the foundation for our processes and our team. We are looking forward to our second year as a campus-wide Title I school and are excited to continue growing our capacity to support families and learners. Our focus for the upcoming year will include behavior support, engagement, retention, and academic achievement.

DAEP End-of-Year Report

As we conclude our inaugural year of implementing the DAEP (Disciplinary Alternative Education Program), we are proud to share the impact this program has had on our students, families, and school community. Throughout the year, we focused not only on academic recovery but also on personal growth, emotional development and life skills. As part of our reflection, we asked students to share what they learned and how they grew through their time in the program. Here are some of their reflections:

- "I learned more about self-awareness and learned better social skills."
- "I learned communication skills, how to stay motivated or send emails—it was helpful to know this."
- "I learned that actions have real consequences and that staying focused on my goals matters."
- "I learned how to be a better person and that sometimes asking for help is okay."
- "This program also helped me build patience & self-control and make me do better with my sleeping schedule."
- "I wanna share that this year Miss Arceli, Miss Richard, and Miss Leyla spend time with me. They make me refresh my mind and help me in a lot of ways. Miss Arcely was like my big sister 'cause I tell her all my things. I meet with her, I learn with her, and I have a very intense connection with her."

In addition to student feedback, we received heartfelt appreciation from parents. One parent shared that, for the first time, her child earned straight A's while in the DAEP program. She also noted that during challenging times at home, the lessons taught in DAEP often aligned with what she was trying to instill at home, providing much-needed support and consistency. She expressed deep gratitude for the program and the progress her daughter made.

We also had a remarkable success story from a senior who joined us in January. She was behind in 10 courses and initially resistant to the program. However, with consistent encouragement and support from our team, she completed all her coursework and graduated on time with her cohort. She later wrote to thank the staff for helping her cross the finish line and end her high school journey on a positive note.

Program Impact

- Total Students Served: 75
- **Expelled Students Re-engaged:** 12 students who had been expelled from their previous districts were able to continue their education through our program rather than sitting out the year.

We are incredibly proud of the growth we've seen this year and are excited to continue building and expanding our behavior campus. The foundation laid this year has set the stage for even greater impact in the years to come.

Curriculum & Instruction

The Title I Curriculum and Instruction team is currently on summer PTO. While they are out, Kit Henderson, our TVAH Title I Curriculum and Instruction Manager, is working on a Canvas and PowerSchool resource for teachers/staff to use as needed. We are also working on Professional Development plans for next year with all principals. Courses are currently scheduled to be available on July 18th.
