- (2) Reader's Workshop, Units of Study, and Lucy Calkins;

- (6) As a staff we are reading two books together: (a) Jo Boaler's *Mathematical Mindsets:*Unleashing Students' Potential Through Creative Math, Inspiring Messages and Innovative
 Teaching and (b) Zaretta Hammond's Culturally Responsive Teaching & the Brain: Promoting
 Authentic Engagement and Rigor Among Culturally and Linguistically Diverse Students.

Goals -

- 1. All students will achieve at least one year of growth in reading and in math as measured by the FastBridge (K-5) and SBAC (4-8) assessments. All students whose reading proficiency is below grade-level will make at least 1.5 years of growth.
- 2. We will use high-leverage instructional strategies so all students master grade-level *Standards* and fill in gaps with any previous grade-level *Standards* they have not yet mastered.
- 3. We will promote high-quality performance character including *Growth Mindset* and the *Belief in Oneself*, as well as the character values detailed in our school-wide common expectations.

Successes -

We continue to focus on student learning through *Future Ready* technology and prioritize excellence, innovation, equity, and collaboration. We have excellent student performances and events for our RHK8 community, interesting field trips, a middle school musical--The Lion King-scheduled for May, and much more. Daily highlights include older students working with younger students by reading stories, being mentors to them, and leading. Our parent community is actively engaged in our school and we value the partnership we share with them. Whether volunteering, connecting with our students' learning, or contributing financially, our parents are an integral part of our learning community. A testament to our community's pride in our school is the growing number of K-5 students who choose to continue in our middle school Options Program. Next year, for example, our projected 6th grade class is entirely from RHK8 5th graders plus one additional student who resides within the RHK8 boundary.
