LETTER FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Dear NKN Middle School Community,

The weather outside is frightful, and the news can sometimes be undelightful. In order to stay in touch during bad weather, please tune in to all available communication avenues. First, sign up with our Flash Alert System through the district website. Navigate to the school closure tab through the "PARENTS" button on the main page. This will give you a text message or email informing you of school closure or emergency. Also, make sure your phone and email information is up-to-date with the school office, as we also send out a voicemail through our school messenger service. Finally, like us on Facebook if you have an account. You will receive a push notification from our page in the event of a school closure or emergency.

With inclement weather expected over the next three months, it is good practice that we are all communicating clearly to each other. Hopefully, we can be doing that at a band concert, basketball game, wrestling tournament, or after school STEM lab workshop and not in the event of an emergency. But in the event an emergency, which requires us to 'stick to the facts and get the word out', you are tuned in to our message through all available means.

The weather can be unpredictable, and so are middle school students. Although we have communication plans in place for adults, students in this stage of development have yet to learn those effective skills. They still pass notes in class, but are much more apt to post something online and not understand the repercussions until it is too late. Lately, the computer apps Saraha and Yellow are ones I highly recommend against. They allow students to send anonymous messages to teach other. More often than not those notes are hurtful and full of negativity. If your child has those apps on their device take them off to save yourself and your child a lot of heartache.

Over the next three months the middle school staff, including Mr. Herder and myself, are going to focus on positive student interactions. We are going to use materials that have been recommended to me by well-respected middle level educators across the state. Don't be surprised if you are asked to complete a survey with your son or daughter about drama, relationships, and positive peer interactions. Our PBIS system is strong here. We are a safe, respect-

ful, and responsible student body, but we can do better. With students having greater access to technology that allows them to be mean to one another we need to step up our efforts to teach them to simply be nice human beings.

Middle school students are growing into young adults. They form peer relationships, hopefully strong and long lasting. Sometimes that road to lifelong friendships is rocky. We have made it our goal as a school to not only teach the academic subjects, but human to human lessons as well. I welcome you to join us in this journey.



IMPORTANT IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

Oregon immunization requirements have changed. Parents, don't let your child get left behind! Note:Doses required vary by a child's age and how long ago they were vaccinated. Please check with your child's school or healthcare provider for details.

Oregon law requires the following shots for school attendance...

A student entering grade six (6) needs:

- 5 Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis (DTaP)
- 4 Polio
- 1 Varicella (chickenpox)
- 2 Measles
- 1 Mumps
- 1 Rubella
- 3 Hepatitis B
- 2 Hepatitis A



- A student entering grade seven through twelve (7-12) needs:
- 5 Diphtheria/Tetanus/Pertussis (DTaP)
- 1 Tdap
- 4 Polio
- 1 Varicella (chickenpox)
- 2 Measles
- 1 Mumps
- 1 Rubella
- 3 Hepatitis B
- 2 Hepatitis A (those entering 7th grade)



ATTENTION PARENTS! Our records indicate several students are in need of further vaccinations. For those students, we have mailed a letter outlining what is needed. Please note: Students still out of compliance on exclusion day (2/21/18) will not be admitted to school.

Note: Beginning March 1, 2014, parents claiming non-medical exemptions will need to provide the school with Oregon Health Authority certificates of documentation. As more information about the new process becomes available, it will be posted at http://l.usa.gov/OregonSchool.
