Curriculum & Instruction

Alaska Effective Instruction Conference

At the end of January, Mrs. Claus attended Alaska's Virtual RTI Conference. She was able to learn from some of the top professionals in the field. One of the highlights from the conference was learning from keynote speaker Stanford math professor Dr. Jo Boaler. Highlights were building procedural fluency, conceptual understanding, and supporting math students to persevere through academic struggle.

Students as Teachers

Four CHS students assisted Mr. Jeffrey in teaching an adult welding class to seven participants from all of POW Island. Each student ran a welding station and adults rotated through stations which included: aluminum and steel MIG, aluminum TIG, oxy fuel cutting and brazing, SMAW 7018, 6011 rod, and plasma cutting.
