Erin Hansford, Director of Instruction	 In response to the DPI's Motion 57, allocating reimbursement up to \$4000 for our district, eight teachers from 4K-2nd grade will participate in 40 hours of Science of Reading literacy training called "Top 10 Tools". Ms. Hansford will coordinate literacy professional development for teachers in grades 3-5, 6-8, and 9-12 to enhance literacy practices in all subjects, supporting the Science of Reading. Additional support will be provided through coaching cycles and professional development opportunities with the Instructional Coach and Reading Specialist. Implementation of literacy professional development will occur throughout the year. Additional professional development is being prepared to help onboard new teachers, associate staff, and bus drivers in collaboration with Siren Bus Company.
Jada Anderson, Pupil Services Director/Athletic Director	 SPED/Pupil Services The SPED department is in year 2 of their Procedural COmpliance Self Assessment Cycle. During this school year, DPI will select a random pool of IEP's for the district to review. In doing so, a team of special education staff will review the selected IEP's to ensure that they are in compliance with state laws and regulations, as well as being implemented to fidelity district wide. Ms. Anderson has worked very closely with CESA representatives on ways to properly train and retain Special Education/Pupil Services staff. During this process, she has been able to identify various onboarding opportunities that can be implemented during various PD trainings and during inservice days.

• Ms. Anderson has taken on the role of 504 coordinator for the district. In doing so, she began meeting with school counseling staff to determine various duties and responsibilities that they might have within this universal system.
 Athletic Updates Ms. Anderson recently participated in the New AD Workshop that was held at the WIAA Office in Stevens Point. During this workshop, she was able to review eligibility requirements, WIAA rules, and network with other smaller districts. Ms. Anderson is working closely with the 6-12 principal to review our current Coaches Handbook and our Extracurricular Activities and Programs Code to make sure they continue to align with our overall vision for Frederic. Ms. Anderson will be holding an all coaches meeting July 27th at the 6-12 building to thoroughly discuss the Coaches Handbook. During this time, roles and responsibilities of the coaches will be discussed.
