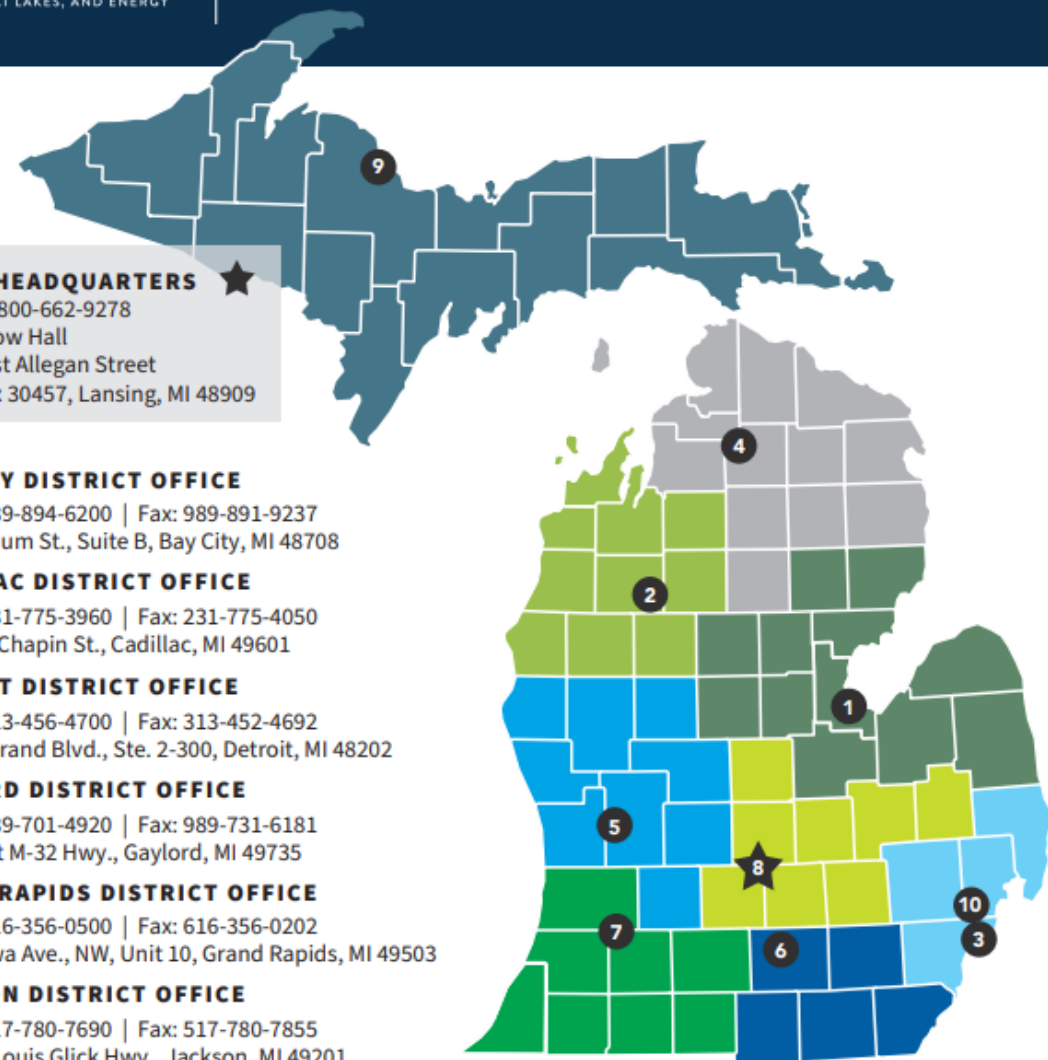

## **Report an emergency to our Pollution Emergency Alerting System (PEAS) hotline**

Call 800-292-4706

An environmental emergency is a sudden threat to public health or the well-being of the environment from the release or potential release of oil, radioactive materials, or hazardous chemicals into the air, land, or water.

This hotline is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

## **Reported an emergency?**

Many incidents reportable to EGLE **also warrant reporting to the federal National Response Center (NRC)**, which serves the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency and the U.S. Coast Guard.

# Response – Notifications

- PEAS reports are directly sent to EGLE IMS and district support staff
- NRC will notify PEAS, but not vice versa
- PEAS can be exercised like the NRC
- Anyone can call PEAS – required by liable party "spiller" however commonly first responders
  - If first responders call, that does **not** make the first responders liable. The "spiller" is still the liable party.
  - 19-page resource document on what types of spills need to be reported
    - When in doubt - call, there is no penalty for calling
