


Understanding CogAT and its use

CogAT (Cognitive Abilities Test) was added to our identification process to capture the <u>Ability</u> of students

CogAT helps us to identify students that have ability not yet reflected in achievement data

CogAT can be individually or group administered

CogAT provides information for parents and teachers on how a student learns information

Who takes the CogAT?



2017-2018

- Students in 1st and 4th grade
- Parents in other grades could request individual testing

2018-19

Students in 1st, 3rd and 4th grade

After 2018-2019

 All students in grades 1-6 will have had or will take the CogAT

Administering CogAT

- 1st grade students took CogAT on iPads in the group learning area
- 3rd and 4th grade students will take CogAT in the computer labs this Feb./March

How are the results shared?

- All families receive a paper copy of <u>Student Narrative</u> with a <u>step-by-step</u> guide to reading the results
- Parents receive the results at conference time
- General Education, Special Education and Interventionist Teachers receive training on reading and using the reports
 - Additional training with results and instructional guides will come as our teachers work with results



Use of Results


With additional data point, we identified students suited for advanced coursework not previously identified using solely achievement data

- 4th grade students moved with CogAT information
 - 8 students moved into Advanced Reading
 - 12 Accelerated Math

CogAT data moves into the Middle School

Students entering middle school fall of 2019-20 will have had the CogAT in 4th grade

CogAT will continue to be used and discussed for placement in

- Accelerated Science
- Accelerated Math
- Honors English
 - Students new to district may be given CogAT if needed to help determine placement
