## Beeville ISD School Health Advisory Council Safe and Drug Free Schools and Communities Meeting Minutes 4-5-10

The Beeville ISD joint SHAC and SDFSC meeting was held on Monday, April 5, 2010 in the Beeville ISD Board Room. Items on the agenda included: Walk Across Texas Challenge Update *Worth the Wait*- Sex Education Curriculum Title IV- SDFSC Program

## Walk Across Texas Challenge Update

Becky Williams, FMC Consultant and Karen Harvey, TJES P.E. teacher explained their campuses have started the *Walk Across Texas Challenge* but not as widespread as originally planned. Cindy Clendennen provided information at the district level in which two teams of 8, one at the administration building and one at the special ed. building have begun. The administration team walked 133.80 miles while the staff at special ed. walked 116.97 miles the first week. Both feel they will reach the goal by the end of the 8 week period.

## Sex Education Curriculum

The SHAC reviewed a grade 8 video from the curriculum *Worth the Wait* and felt the program would be very beneficial for students at Moreno Middle School. Committee members also examined the curriculum and determined *Worth the Wait* would be an asset to the existing BISD sex education program. The SHAC agreed to recommend to the Board of Trustees the curriculum to be implemented in grades 7 and 8 during the 2010 – 2011 school year. The SHAC will review materials for grade 6 and high school to determine if implementation at those grade levels would be beneficial as well. Mrs. Clendennen will share information about the curriculum and present the recommendation to the School Board at the June School Board meeting.

## Title IV- SDFSC Program

Mrs. Clendennen shared with the SHAC and SDFSC that Title IV funds will no longer be offered through NCLB after this school year. Activities to be affected include, Red Ribbon Week activities (red ribbons for the school and community), funding for the Teen Leadership program at MMS, student drug survey offered in grades 6, 8, and 10, *Motivational Productions* presentations for students, and campus security. Some of these expenses such as Teen Leadership at MMS and campus security will be included in the local budget in order for the service to continue.
