Mr. Passarelli: Hi everybody. I want to say congratulations to the Board on their recognition for tonight. I want to thank Mark his work in the last three weeks to transition me into this role.

Summary of our school year forecast. About 98 percent of our fully operating plan. When I look at February. I would expect that one to be a little bit higher. Our spending is picking up in February to get to that 19.1 million. Seeing favorability in the salary line specifically certified teachers. A lot of savings on the coaching offset by security we had to hire about three security people to fill some positions. Professional services, that variance is due to people services. This is due to upbringing some in-house services purchase orders. On the property services, small variance of about 910. Accrual spend on the maintenance, repairs for maintenance there to go spend some money. Other purchases special ed, 451 negative, special ed out of district. We're going to be favorable on the special ed transportation there from a plan prospective. On equipment is a little bit of negative, security enhancements there where we spent that money to date in February.

Mr. Gildea: No questions.

Mr. Passarelli: Going over grants.

Mr. Gildea: Any real chance we're getting the 95.

Mr. Izzo: Yes.

Mr. Passarelli: Thank you.

XVII. Shared Services Consideration

Dr. Conway: We had discussions came up with the City started out taking care of the stairs. We had put out the idea that we would assume responsibility for the stairs and like we do other things something we have been able to budget for, we would just sent invoice to the City at the end of the year. The conversation moved from there for the fieldhouse itself. Is that something that Matt Cunningham could possibly contribute to.

It is really because of Matt that I even had the conversation. And so last Friday I got a call from the City following up on our conversations. Taking a look at the field house because Matt is Matt it makes sense we open up the discussion about all the other buildings in the City. Bring that back to the Board as well as to the City bring it to the Board of Alderman as well. I want to thank Matt for considering what he has on his plate right now and move forward.

Mr. Gildea: It would be a potential for Matt or his Department. Proposal for Matt to take on some of the buildings in the City. You'd have to square out the details. Are we comfortable with Doc with the concept, coming back to us with the finances. We should at least have that discussion whether we're okay with the concept, before a whole lot of people do the work.

Dr. Conway: For the City possibly, they do realize there would be a need for a maintenance person that Matt would have oversight of to do the work in some of the buildings.

That would be in addition.

Mr. Gildea: It would be a City person. The fact that the City is bringing on additional buildings, it would be a City employer Ken.

Mr. Marcucio: I just don't understand why that couldn't be under Public Works. Why can't Public Works do it? If they're going to hire a City person.

Mr. Gildea: It doesn't commit us to anything this evening.

Dr. Conway: As soon as there is a committee, absolutely. There's no committee now, it's really just informal discussions. Reaching out to see if Matt would be interested. Then Matt touring the buildings. So right now, just in discussion phase. It's really with Andrew and myself and Matt and Mark.

Mr. Gildea: I'm not entirely sure where regionalization ends up.

Mr. Izzo: We want to if the Board is reasonable to at least hearing the facts then he and I will put together a rough proposal. What does he need from resources above and beyond what is here. But it would be interesting as far as doing work for the City. That's kind of where we are. It's a fact finding mission. Thank you.

Mr. Gildea: Those are all excellent points. All discussion.

Mr. Izzo: Part-time custodians.

Dr. Conway: We expect that to be part of the discussions. It really was just the fieldhouse and the stairs. Our building, City Hall.

Mr. Cunningham: There's no way I would take that on. The City doesn't really advocate the funds. At the very least I would report and give them my take on them. How they approach the custodial aspects of their buildings. Just an idea. I have no problem with the other buildings. That's fair.

Mr. Kurtyka: I agree though we should help them. It's a great idea. It's an honor that the City came and noticed that the job that you're doing.

Mr. Cunningham: Doc, this is something to look into.

Mr. Foley: It wouldn't hurt the City to come up with some suggestions. I'm acceptable to see what they would propose.

Ms. Harris: I would welcome to see something in writing black and white on all aspects.

Mr. Gildea: There's enough there Doc should get the details. What kind of reimbursement would the Board of Ed would get and then report back to us.

Dr. Conway: With the retirement of Mr. Burns, HR explore what it would look like if we shared HR services with the City, benefits and pension. At least three of the contracts that they have for their employees, we have the same for our employees. If that's something you want me to pursue partnership on that or not, just let me know.

Mr. Kurtyka: It's always been an issue with shared services for the City. It never worked out.

Dr. Conway: I don't know.

Mr. Kurtyka: Added responsibility means additional pay. City has to pay a portion of the salary.

Mr. Gildea: These are the details that Doc would have to work out. Come back from Doc with information and data.

Dr. Conway: This one might be worth exploring. On average across the State about 100,000. Probably together combine a track a different level candidate for a much different service.

Mr. Marcucio: This is nothing new. The Business Manager is going to be shared by the City. That's been a topic for many years.

Mr. Gildea: The Business Manager one is difficult. I think there is a conflict there myself. I'm just you know information gatherer. I want to look at the data. I'm just a detailed person. It's hard for me to make decisions without data. I don't know if there's a savings for the City. So it's possible we may save money for these positions that will help do other things. Decision tonight, is there a way to offer support to provide a better service that's currently being provided.

Mr. Marcucio: I'll say one last thing about this how could you trust them when they wouldn't shovel the stairs. Last thing I'm saying.

Mr. Gildea: All right. If it's not a ton of work for Doc, come back with information and data.

You'll notice that teachers this year, lots of artwork from students imbedded into the program of studies. All students will be able to meet during that time.

In our program of studies, we focus on sharing more about who we are as the school and what we offer. The teacher approved a portrait of a graduate. Additionally, what parents can expect from us as students as a team. We are sharing with families on what they can expect from us as they are part of Derby High School. Families say they don't know who to go to for help. Links to key members of the team as students are planning their programming. So one of the biggest changes in terms of our course offerings, excited about a brand new partnership with Housatonic Community College. We are moving towards a new Allied Health Program. They are pursuing lots of different health tracks, nursing, a medical profession or other types of related healthcare services. Lot of core classes that kids need, chemistry, biology, certain math classes that prepare all entry level classes in college.

Housatonic has this certificate program that will allow DHS to offer an Allied Health Career Track path. I'll just feature some of the key parts of the classes. Different careers in healthcare and give them a chance to say if this is really for me. It will also offer three credits at Housatonic Community College. All the other courses required for the full program 28 credit certificate program. So our shift right now is looking at how we can make our current honor courses dual credit. So kids can take that class at Derby High School like they always do, actually be able to get three credits towards their college transcript they get three credits towards their transcripts through Housatonic. Teachers be eligible to become instructors. We started going through with what the credentials would be with our faculty to look and see how we might be offer that inhouse at no cost to the district at no cost to the taxpayers for us to be able to start the class.

In the fall for sure health exploratory class will be offered. Additional other classes as well certificate program. Very exciting stuff and we're proud of it.

Mr. Gildea: Any questions.

Mrs. Olson: Kids get an opportunity. It's a real transcript. Kids get a real credit. Yes, 100 percent kids will get credit they walk away with. That grade and transcript stay with you. We want kids to be set up for success.

Mr. Gildea: Go back to item 3.

XX. COVID Updates

Dr. Conway: We have seen updates. I'm sure you got the phone calls, emails, Bradley School last week, Irving this past week. We are seeing an update in children now as opposed to adults. Thirteen students right now, 3 adults. Continue to watch out. Changes with the State are coming. Travel Advisory, changes will be announced tomorrow. Wait until decisions on tomorrow.

We will have an official come back to school on April 19th. Also plans for each child for support. It is an adjustment. We want to really do it right, but we are already seeing more kids coming back just this week through that campaign.

Mr. Gildea: Continue to make plans to work towards a goal of trying to reverse that.

Dr. Conway: Yes, 100 percent. Still offer remote at least until the end of the year, if not into next year, requires at least 50 percent of that synchronous. We will plan to offer remote in a manner prescribed.

Ms. Hyder: Why do we have to offer remote in September.

Dr. Conway: Right now it's mandated. And through the Governor on Wednesday, we expect continue through the remainder of the year into next year.

Ms. Hyder: We can all go into jam packed restaurant but we can't watch our kids play sports and we have to offer remote.

Dr. Conway: Tuesday, late in the day there was a decision. They too are receiving as much people want to be back in person, receiving a tremendous amount of response from families that want to remain remote. We are going to do everything in our power to get kids back in person.

We're in a unique position now. Really, April 19th, everybody coming back. We have offered that all the time. This is the official. The school's been working on a plan for the first day of school for the excitement of it so that kids have a reason to come.

Massachusetts announced April 28th everybody coming back in, no more remote. Now, they're offering a waiver. There is a strong push from both sides from families that to remain remote for a variety of reasons. I do want to say we have amazing staff. They're all in. They want all kids back in.

Mr. Gildea: Any other questions.

Mr. Marcucio: Doc, when you send out these emails notifying us, is it possible to notify us exactly how it affected that school?

Dr. Conway: I don't always have that full report from the school. It might have to be an hour later or so.

Mr. Marcucio: A day or two later, I just want to know the effect. At this point in time, what are you doing how this is affecting the students academically.

Dr. Conway: So when you compare our fall data, it's not exact because it is a different group of kids, multiple ways to compare. We do that as well. The other piece you don't see is the social emotional part of this is as well that we're concerned about.
