CEMS Assessment Updates 2021-2022

- As you may be aware, the Alaska Department of Education & Early Development (DEED), selected the Northwest Evaluation Association (NWEA) to provide Alaska’s innovative state assessment. As 49 of Alaska’s 54 school districts already administer NWEA’s MAP Growth assessment three (3) times throughout the school year, the new assessment system will streamline the testing experience for our students, families, teachers, and administrators by consolidating assessment and reporting to one platform.
- It is my understanding that the CEMS will administer MAP Growth interim assessments in the fall and winter to measure student performance independent of grade level. Then, in the spring, we will administer a summative test that produces not only summative proficiency schools for accountability, but also MAP Growth scores, so CCSD/CEMS may measure fall-to-spring academic growth.
