We have great kids at IVHS and salute them for their outstanding efforts showing *Cougar PRIDE* and to our local businesses who help move PBS forward.



COUGAR DEN WEB STORE

We now offer some of our items for sale at the **Cougar Den web store**. You (or your student) can make purchases or pay outstanding bills on your student's account, using a credit or debit card.

To login, first enter the Student ID number. The initial password is set to student's first initial plus last name. For example, the password for Susie Smith would be ssmith. When you login as a student for the first time, we recommend that you change your password.

• For new online purchases, login in at the top of the screen in the spaces provided.

For payments on existing debts or to change your password, click on the link below that reads <u>login into your Online Account here</u>.

We also offer alumni and the general public the ability to make donations and purchases online. To start, click on the "Non-Student" button.

You will be taken to a screen where you can enter your information, which will allow you to purchase items through the online store.

Please note that purchases at the Cougar Den will include a 7.1% convenience fee, to cover the charges for this service. For example, if you are purchasing a \$60.00 Season Family Sports pass, you will be charged \$64.26.
