Ms. Nugent, Ms. Woika and Ms. Buckmaster provided the members with an update on how things are coming along in their PBIS teams and the affect their efforts are having on problem behaviors and school culture and climate. Mr. Lawyer was not present at the meeting.

Unfinished Business

Garibaldi Grade School Seismic Upgrade, Mark Sybouts

Mr. Sybouts shared that we had our first meeting after the contractors had a chance to do estimates on the plans. They plan to have the completed set of plan documents ready to submit for permits in April. He explained that we will not have to do the major shuffling of furniture that we had to do at Nehalem. They will be able to move furniture to one side of the room, cover it and do their work and move it back.

District LED Lighting Project, Steve Baertlein

Mr. Baertlein shared that the lighting project is complete, he will have some numbers as far as savings very soon. Mark may want to wait a full year. He has not had any complaints, people love it. The walkway lights will be in soon, all the product has been ordered.

Neah-Kah-Nie High School Welding Lab, Steve Baertlein

Mr. Baertlein stated that the lab is complete. The punch list is done, there are just a couple little things that need to be done and Dan Gernert is very happy. Mr. Erlebach shared that we saved \$10,000 in electrical costs. Mr. Baertlein has also connected Mr. Gernert with Paul Watt in Bay City. Mr. Watt hires a lot of high school students.

District-wide Exterior Door Locks, Steve Baertlein

Mr. Baertlein stated that he is still waiting for a bid. Every building has different needs. If the price is so much that we cannot afford to do all the buildings at once, depending on the cost, he would like to do Garibaldi first because they are the most vulnerable, they cannot see anyone coming in.

Nehalem Elementary Stair Landing, Steve Baertlein

Mr. Baertlein stated that it is being monitored. They have drilled the hole and are monitoring soil depths. to see if there is movement. If there is no movement they will just pump in foam in the void and it will be done.

Mr. Baertlein shared that they had a phone conference today with the Bonneville Power Agency (BPA), they have a solar power program that we might look into.

A representative from the University of Oregon wants to place a seismic sensor at Nehalem Elementary School. They will be coming out on Wednesday to meet with Ms. Woika.

Reports

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Neah-Kah-Nie High School Chemistry Lab Update and Potential Bid Award, Paul Erlebach We received two bids, there was only a \$700 difference between the high bid and the low bid. He spent two days doing reference checks. We sent the winning bidder a notice of disqualification. They did not meet the minimum qualifications. The bidder has five day to appeal the disqualification in writing. Tomorrow we will notify the second place bidder, Columbia Cascade Construction Inc. Mr. Baertlein did the reference checks, there were no issues.

<u>M-Aeder/2nd Mahoney motion to accept the bid from Columbia Cascade Construction Inc.</u> for \$380,500, for the Neah-Kah-Nie High School chemistry classroom remodel, pending the appeal of the Notice of Disgualification issued to Hassle Free Renovations, Corp. 2019-2020 Inter-district, and Tuition Process

Concurrently,</u> <u>the Neah-Kah-Nie School District will release fifteen (15) students on a rolling first come,</u> <u>first served basis beginning May 1, 2019 until filled.
