and with a quorum established, the Board considered and passed the following order:

IT IS HEREBY RESOLVED AND ORDERED BY THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE PASADENA INDEPENDENT SCHOOL DISTRICT THAT A TAX OF \$ 1.1722 on each one hundred dollars valuation of taxable property in said district is hereby levied for the year 2025, and said total tax is hereby segregated and allocated as follows:

- a. A tax of \$ 0.3400 on each one hundred dollars of valuation of taxable property in said district is hereby levied for the purpose of paying interest on and principal of the outstanding schoolhouse bonds of said district.
- b. A tax of \$ 0.8322 on each one hundred dollars of valuation of taxable property in said district is hereby levied for the maintenance and operation of the public schools in said district.

The tax rate adopted herein exceeds the District's Voter-Approval Tax Rate due to increased expenditures necessary to respond to a disaster. An election to ratify the adopted tax rate is not required pursuant to Texas Tax Code § 26.042(e), because the tax rate adopted herein is in response to a disaster in the year following the disaster. In adopting this tax rate, the Board of Trustees affirmatively finds that on July 8, 2024, Hurricane Beryl made land fall in Texas as a Category 1 hurricane and caused widespread damage in the District, that a disaster declaration was issued by the Acting Governor of Texas due to the
