<u>Goal One – Student Learning</u>

Targeted Summer School = District 66 is gearing up for its annual Targeted Summer School program, scheduled to run throughout the month of June. Our Targeted Summer School program is specifically designed to cater to students identified by their school teams as needing additional support in reading and/or math, whether through our Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS) or an Individualized Educational Program (IEP). Across the district, a total of 113 students have been recommended for participation, with approximately 94 students confirmed to attend. These sessions will extend over 14 days, ensuring continued learning for those who benefit from targeted intervention. To deliver these essential services, we have assembled a team of 13 certified teachers, encompassing a mix of Special Education Teachers, Interventionists, and General Education Teachers. Each teacher will have a total of three 50-minute intervention sessions of either reading and/or math. In support of accessibility, bus transportation has been arranged for all participants, with around 65 students expected to utilize this service. The overarching goal of Targeted Summer School is to prevent academic regression, allowing students to maintain the progress achieved throughout the school year. By taking a proactive approach, our goal aims to sustain and build upon the learning momentum, ensuring each student is set up for continued success.

<u>Goal Two – Whole Student Development</u>

Student Services Parent University Wrap Up = The Parent Advisory Council (P.A.C.) recently hosted its inaugural Student Services Parent University on April 11, 2024. This event aimed to support parents with children benefiting from student support services, such as those covered by a 504 Plan or an Individualized Educational Plan (IEP).
