Imagine Learning (Edgenuity)

Harlem High School has been using Edgenuity, by Imagine Learning, to support credit recovery options for high school students since the fall of 2016. The credit recovery option through Edgenuity allows staff to assess students on standards aligned to Harlem High School courses and the Illinois Standards. Students are initially assessed and may advance past standards already mastered from the first time they took the course, and student progress can be easily tracked through the platform. Staff updates the standards within the platform regularly to align all credit recovery courses to courses offered at Harlem High School. Last summer was the first time since prior to the pandemic that students were charged for credit recovery, and we based the number of reusable licenses on previous credit recovery numbers, to 120 seats. Based on participation last summer and this school year, we are asking the board to approve a one year contract of 75 reusable seats with Edgenuity. The seat price has increased from \$99 to \$119, and with the decrease in licenses, the overall savings is more than \$3,000 overall.

CommonLit Pro 360

CommonLit Pro 360 is part of the Tier 1 ELA curriculum used to support literacy at the high school. The program is a top rated ELA curriculum resource by EdReports, that provides both curriculum and assessment resources for teachers to use to support student learning. Assessment ties questions directly to grade level standards to assist teachers with the ability to determine understanding and adjust instruction to support student needs. The middle school has a multi-year contract with the company that extends through the 2029-2030 school year, so the purchase supports the alignment of curriculum between the middle school and the high school. The overall cost of the CommonLit Pro 360 program has increased from \$6,500 to \$6,850. If Harlem High School agrees to a three year agreement, we can lock in the price of the cost of the program at \$6,300 over the three year period for a total cost of \$18,900.

Rock Valley College Dual and Articulated MOU and Running Start Agreement for 26-27
Harlem Consolidated School District partners with Rock Valley College (RVC) each year to provide students with early postsecondary credits and some industry recognized credentials. The Running Start Agreement has not changed in any way, and the fees remain the same. The Dual and Articulated MOU with RVC has changed, with the most notable changes relating to students being subject to Rock Valley's grading and academic dishonesty policies. There is also additional language stating that Rock Valley and Harlem will work together to review data about student enrollment and success. Fees for providing students with dual and articulated credit remain at \$50 per course. The district and high school are in agreement to accept changes within the agreement as is.

These fees are paid with local funds.
