I would like to express my concerns regarding the sale of this property for the development of housing.
Primarily I believe the resulting traffic will be an issue. Salquist and Chase will certainly see an up tick in volumn. SE 282nd is already congested at the Lusted and Powell Valley area. During heavy traffic periods the backup from the three way stop on Powell Valley and 282nd extends through the Lusted/282nd intersection causing grid lock.
The additional traffic that will be generated will increase flow on SE Orient, adding to the growing congestion at the Salquist/Orient intersection. A traffic study during Covid when the flow was unusually low does not reflect the current situation. Has a more recent survey been done?
A second concern is the type of housing destined for the development. The townhome type of housing, especially the three story design slated for this area will certainly generate additional students for the district. Has the load on Kelly Creek Elementry and Gordon Russell been considered?
