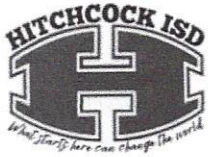

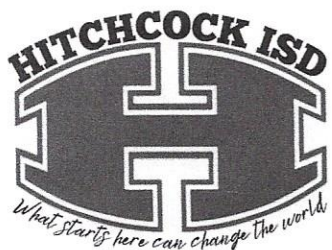

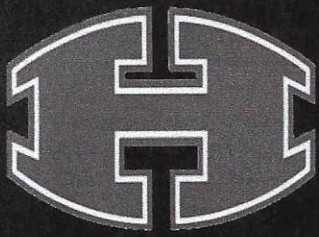

Social Media Highlights:

- We are up to 13,135 followers and grew our following by 219 in September.
- We created 311 posts, generating 607,907 views and engaging 35,560 people. Additionally, 1064 users clicked on links within our content. Our engagement rate is up at 5.8% per impression, which continues to exceed the industry average.
- Our post of the Van Vleck coach singing the National Anthem reached 20,604 people and our photos from HPS Open House had the top engagement rate of 101.9%. Second was Dr. Henson's tour of all five campuses reaching 13,173 community members.
- We are outpacing September of 2024 by 86% in reach, and our post links are up 232.5% over last year.

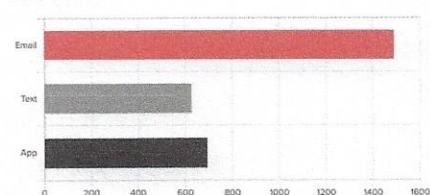

Tuesday, September 2nd

- HS student referred to campus officer for disorderly conduct – language complaint.

- HS student was searched after setting of a vape detector, no vape was found but student was found to be in violation of the student code of conduct. Referred to admin.
- Parent was given a trespass warning for SES due to abusive language toward staff.
- Two HS students were involved in an incident at the field house. One student pushed another into a brick wall causing significant injuries. The injured student was treated by the nurse. The aggressive student was charged and placed in the juvenile justice center.

Tuesday September 9th

- Two HS students were provoking each other into fighting. Officer intervened before an incident occurred and referred both students to admin.
- HS Student made a victim outcry. Referred to Hitchcock PD due to jurisdiction.

Wednesday September 10th

- SES students involved in a fight with minor injuries. Referred to admin due to age.
- HS student taken into custody for possession of THC vape.
- Two traffic stops for school zone infractions on Stewart.

Thursday September 11th

- PES student made an outcry of physical abuse, but later recanted the statement. Admin referred incident to CPS for documentation.
- Traffic stop for speeding 1200 Delaney.
- CMS student taken into custody for possession of THC vape.
- HS student made passive threats toward a teacher when his phone was taken away. Event was noncriminal and referred to admin.
- Officer had to deescalate a verbal disturbance between HS students. Referred to admin.
- CMS student threatened to stab another student with a sewing needle on the bus. Parent is deciding if they wish to pursue an assault by threat charge.
- Issue between two groups of HS students was reported. Referred to admin.
- Attempted fire drill at Primary Elementary. Alarm was found to be left in bypass mode by alarm company.

- Officer had to deescalate a verbal disturbance between HS students. Referred to admin.

- Officer investigated an ongoing issue between HS students where a threat was allegedly made. Investigation proved the threat to be unfounded. Referred to transportation and admin.

- Welfare check on employee after reported disturbance and her being removed from her home by her husband. Contact was made, employee was safer. Referred to HR.
- Office4r looked into TikTok account speaking negatively about a HS student. Unable to determine the origin.
- HS student was found to be in possession of a nicotine vape, complaint issued.

Tuesday September 16th

- SES student threatened to stab another student with a pencil. Victim's parents declined charged but wanted the incident documented.
- Three HS students were found to be in possession of vapes. Two of the vapes contained THC, one contained nicotine. The student's possession of THC were taken into custody and transported Atwater Juvenile Justice Center. The student with the nicotine vape was issued a complaint and released.
- While working SES, officer located a 96 years old man crawling on the ground. Officer assisted the man to his feet and contacted EMS.

Wednesday September 17th

- Safety and security presentation for substitute staff at admin building.
- Met with Principal Neeley regarding additional safety measures during football games.
- Disturbance in HS cafeteria. Video of the incident was pulled, incident referred to admin.
- HS student reported stolen phone. Under investigation.
- HS student hit another student with a lanyard trying to provide a fight. Video pulled, referred to admin.

Thursday September 18th

- CPS referral at the HS. Incident referred to La Marque PD.
- Meeting to discuss Homecoming.
- HS student found to be in possession of a THC vape. Student was taken into custody and transported to Atwater Juvenile Justice Center.
- 2 CMS students issued complaints for disorderly conduct – fighting.
- Elementary school student made an improper comment to another student, referred to administration.
- A disagreement led to a student making a comment of having a "Glock 19". Administrative search was conducted and no weapon was found, referred to administration and threat assessment team.

Friday September 19th

- An HS student was observed talking to an unknown person in Dodge SUV. The unknown person was found to be a dual credit student, not an adult. Referred to admin.
- An HS student expressed ideations of self-harm. Student was transported to UTMB for evaluation.

Monday September 22nd

- Two CMS students got in a shoving match over a basketball game. Referred to admin.
- Issues between 4 HS students have continued despite administrative efforts and stay away agreements. One student is the instigator, a meeting with her father was conducted. He was advised that this is the final warning before harassment charges are filed.

Tuesday September 23rd

- CMS student was suspended and picked up by his father. An employee witnessed the child being pushed out the door by the father. Oc. Zuniga retrieved the child and he was released to his mother.
- SES student attempted to leave the campus, but was sopped by admin. The student was later able to get out and had to be retrieved by Ofc. Samuelson. Referred to admin.
- Verbal disturbance between JV volleyball players after a loss. It was reported that a parent entered the locker room and initiated the disturbance, however, this was disproven. The parent was told about the disturbance by their daughter, but they never left the gym.

Wednesday September 24th

- HS student reported that his ex-girlfriend has been harassing and assaulting him at his bus stop. Charges were suspended by the DA's office. Follow up to be conducted.
- HS student reported that another student attempted a fist bump her but she ignored him. She claimed that he put his hand on the back of her head when she walked by. Incident investigated, no evidence to support a charge.

Thursday September 25th

- A parent contacted CMS to see if their student was on campus, he is a DAEP student and was sent walking to school. The student was found to be absent. Ofc. Zuniga was able to locate the student and transported him to school.
- HS student reported another student calling him inappropriate names, referred to admin.
- HS student reported inappropriate sexual comments were made by CMS student on the bus. Video requested.
- HS student reported that she believes another student is showing inappropriate pictures of her to other students. Several students were interviewed, but no evidence to support the claim was found. Students and parents were advised of the consequences of possession of intimate pictures of underaged persons.
- Two PES students were caught fighting while reviewing security footage. Referred to admin.
- SES student reported a staff member having a firearm on campus. An administrative search was conducted, no firearm was located.
- SES student pushed another student's head into a Chromebook. Parents were contacted and they declined charges.

Friday September 26th

- HS student pushed another student into a wall. Victim student's parents were contacted and they declined charges. The incident was referred to admin.
- Two HS students confronted another student at dismissal regarding the push in the previous incident. One student took a fighting stance, but was held back by another student until Ofc. Harp could intervene.
- Security for varsity football.

Monday September 29th

- Meeting with HS parent over an incident that occurred last year. Parent wanted another student removed from school over the incident. Parent was advised that the student was disciplined over the incident and has done nothing to be removed.
- A fight occurred in the library of CMS. Complaint issued.
- SPED student a SES had to be physically restrained after he struck another student. Restraint report completed and parent contacted.

Tuesday September 30th

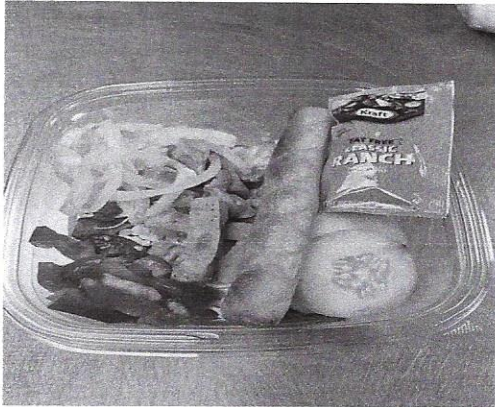
- Mental health concern at the HS. Student was referred to the counselor.
