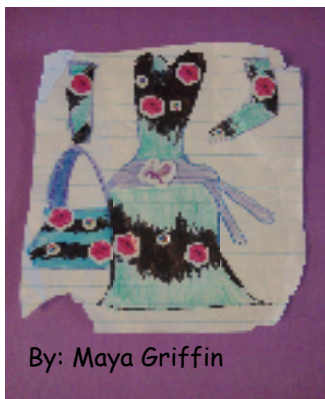

Evergreen PTO sponsors our annual Harvest Festival.
