

Basic Allotment Increase

The legislature set the system up to be moved by the Basic Allotment and increasing the BA automatically triggers funding for key programs and state priorities. The legislature also nearly unanimously set a funding level in HB 3

Inflation Index

Without an index to inflation, districts remain on a fixed budget.
Indexing the basic allotment to inflation ensures that teachers and other staff are given regular cost of living raises.

Funding Gaps

To the extent the legislature chooses to direct money via allotments, those allotments should be based on the costs of those requirements and activities.

Local Control in Spending

Every district in Texas is unique with unique needs. Restricted spending applies a onesize-fits-all approach to an extremely diverse set of schools and students.


