Subject: Assessment Update

As we approach the new year and "Assessment Season" begins, it is important to update the Board of Education regarding the tests administered in District 23 and the purpose behind those assessments. As indicated in the chart below, the majority of the assessments are required by the State of Illinois for accountability purposes. Although many of these tests are mandated, they provide useful information to our students, parents, teachers, administrators, and community about how our students "measure up".

As you may recall, a few years ago, we streamlined our local assessments by removing the FastBridge assessments from our universal screening process and using i-Ready as a universal screener for reading and math, instead of the combination of NWEA MAP and i-Ready we had used previously. We continue to utilize FastBridge for progress monitoring and gathering additional data to better understand our students academically. Our assessments provide valuable information used for placement as well as for a temperature check on how our students are meeting the Illinois Learning Standards. We study this data and use the information for a portion of the evaluation of teachers, schools, programs, and much more. While testing is important, we always keep in mind that these types of assessments are just <u>one piece</u> of data and do not comprise the entire picture of student, teacher, and programmatic success.

Although there are many assessments listed, we are focused on the day-to-day work of our Prospect Heights School District 23 Mission Statement which is to engage ALL students in experiences that inspire EACH to grow as learners, individuals, and community members.
