Mr. Pelofske met with just under 40 students (~10% of the Upper School). The students were selected to be a mix of those with IEP's, 504's, ethnic/cultural backgrounds, new-to-Nova and veteran students, as well as academically strong and challenged students. The student groups aimed to have representation 2+ from each potential demographic of students represented here at school.

82% rated the school year a 3 or 4 (comfortable or very comfortable)

# Most common challenges?

- Managing & keeping up with homework, feeling tired & hungry during the day, and meeting new people/making new friends.
- Only 5 students had concerns about Covid or illnesses happening at school

## What has gone well?

Being in class and **at school with my peers**, being **in-class with my teachers**, and feeling settled/back to a **familiar routine** (having a regular class schedule)

#### What has a teacher done to help you this year?

- Allowed re-takes or corrections, reduced amount of work, and given extra time on an assignment.
- "I do know that teachers will give extensions and had teachers give out extra credit".

#### From listening sessions:

- Nearly all felt they could go to teacher(s) for help, and majority had at least once, but common reasons they didn't was worry about how their peers might see them not feeling like they had time to ask.
- High school students described feeling more exhausted as the year continues, not
  only from schoolwork but "social exhaustion" being around other students &
  friends/talking during the day (even if getting more sleep than before).
- Very much appreciate when teachers give working time in class, chance to ask for help one-on-one.
- Harder to keep up with homework after school because so tired from the school schedule, more school work in past month especially.
