Greetings from the Foley Public Schools Activities Department,

An Incredible Winter Season

The Foley Falcons had (and in a few cases are still having) an incredible Winter Season. Below is a quick recap of some of the highlights:

- **One Act Play** - Granite Ridge Conference Champions, Subsection 5A North Champions, Section 5A Champions, Class A State Festival Participants
- **Math League** - Section Runners-Up - this is the highest place Foley has ever earned since Math League implemented sections. Zach Johnson finished in 5th Place in the Rum River Division (over 70 participants) and 5th Place in the Section.
- **Wrestling** - Section 6AA Champions, Class AA State Tournament 4th Place Finish, Seth Ramsdell, Wyatt Wall, Jacob DeMarais, Hunter Wilhelmi, Teddy Rasmussen, and Will Gutormson all competed in the Class AA State Individual Tournament, Mark Dierkes was named the Section 6AA Assistant Coach of the Year and Jacob and Justin Bowland were named the Section 6AA Co-Head Coaches of the Year. Wyatt Wall earned career win number 175. He is just the third Foley Falcon to surpass that milestone.
- **Knowledge Bowl** - Granite Ridge Conference Champions, Class AA Sub Regional Champions, and finished in 3rd Place at the Regional Competition missing the State Tournament by only 0.5 points
- **Girls Basketball** - Advanced to the Section 6AA Semifinals for the first time since 2015
- **Boys Basketball** - Jack Abfalter became just the 6th Boys Basketball Player in school history to reach the 1,000 career points milestone.
- **Speech** - Has had several 1st Place finishes thus far and has high hopes for earning a chance for a State Tournament appearance starting with the Subsection Meet on April 13th.
