### What is Public School Open Enrollment?

Wisconsin's inter-district public school open enrollment program allows parents to apply for their children to attend school districts other than the one in which they reside. Applications may be submitted to up to three nonresident school districts.

### Who may participate in open enrollment?

Pupils in 5-year-old kindergarten to grade 12 may apply to participate in open enrollment.

Open enrollment for prekindergarten, 4-year-old kindergarten and early childhood education is limited. Parents should call their resident school districts to find out if their preschool-aged children qualify for open enrollment.

### How and when may parents apply?

The open enrollment application period for the 2018-19 school year is from February 5-April 30, 2018. The application period closes at 4:00 p.m. on April 30, 2018. Late applications will not be accepted for any reason.

### **Unity's Illness Policy More Relevant Than Ever**

This year, the influenza season is more severe than usual. To help reduce the number of infections, Unity School District has an Illness Policy (453.3) that provides guidance for parents. It also defines which illnesses require exclusion from the school setting.

Children should be excluded from school when a fever is 100 degrees or above, or accompanied by behavior changes or other symptoms of illness, such as rash, sore throat, vomiting, etc. Children must be fever-free for 24 hours before returning to school without fever reducing medication.

Parents/guardians are urged to update their emergency contact information in Infinite Campus so that if their child is symptomatic during the school day, the school nurse can communicate with them as soon as possible.

Parents are encouraged to inform the school nurse at (715) 825-2101 x3010 if their child is diagnosed with a confirmed case of influenza. Additionally, if a parent ever has questions about whether they should send their child to school, they can call the school nurse with their concerns.

# Inclement Weather Information

The decision to close or delay school due to inclement weather is a complicated one. There are many factors that must be considered and each school district is different. Unity School District is unique in that most of the students are bussed or transported to school daily. Each decision at Unity School District regarding school closings or delays includes consultation with others, such as the Polk County Highway Department, National Weather Service, and other area school districts.

Unity School District considers school closings or delays due to inclement weather when there is a significant concern for student safety. Generally, school closings or delays due to cold weather may be considered when temperatures are below -20°F and/or wind chill temperatures are below -40°F.

Unity School District considers school closings or delays due to snow or freezing rain when road conditions are hazardous. Closings or delays due to snow are dependent upon road conditions and not total snow accumulations. Snow accumulations vary greatly by location and are a concern when adversely impacting road conditions.

If school remains in session, it is important to clothe your child appropriately for the conditions. Ensuring that there is no exposed skin in cold weather, in addition to warm insulated clothing, is very important. The playground remains open for outside recess to -10°F, so please send appropriate winter apparel to school with your child. If appropriate apparel is needed, please contact the elementary principal or counselor.

If conditions are a concern where you live, please communicate those conditions to your child's school office. It is important to note whether a road or driveway is hazardous or unplowed. Additionally, please communicate with your child's office if your child will be absent due to acute inclement weather issues where you live, when school is in session.

The Parent Notification System will continue to keep you informed of Unity's school closings and other important announcements. Please share with your child's office any changes to your contact information.
