Action Plan Steps and Expenditures

- 1. We will hire a Reading Intervention Specialist to organize our reading volunteers and do reading intervention groups (\$10,000)
- 2. We will hire a computer specialist to make sure students get their Lexia reading program minutes (\$7,000)
- 3. We will hire intervention aides to work in classrooms to help with small reading groups. (\$3,000)
- 4. We will purchase books for our school-wide Battle of the Books (500)
- 5. We will hire tutors for Summer School (\$500)
- 6. We will fund a summer reading program. That will track the number of minutes that students read during the summer. (\$250)
- 7. We will purchase Acadience for 4th-6th grades so we can track progress (1,000)

8. We will buy Lexia licenses for students that the State grant doesn't cover. (1,500)

9. We will purchase classroom sets of reading books and novels. (\$3,500)

10. We will fund a FRY word list summer reading program. We will test each students FRY sight word knowledge before school gets out May 2025 and then see how many thing can increase over the summer. (\$250)
