Over the course of the season, Calder's excitement grew alongside his catches. Each new beaver seemed to outdo the last, with sizes that left seasoned trappers tipping their hats in amazement. Among his impressive haul were a 1X at 64 inches, two 2X's measuring 66 and 68 inches, and two jaw-dropping whopper 3X's at 72 and 74 inches.

Calder enjoyed his dad videoing his catch, he estimated the length and weight (and was almost spot on every time), and telling what trap was used. He looks forward to keeping a few for wall mounts and pillows, while allowing his mom to make some puff balls with scraps, then selling skulls and fur to artisans and collectors.

April Teacher Til By Jen Whicker By Jen Whicker April is Mathematics and Statistics Awareness Month! This would be a great time to plan a Math Night for you and your family. Here are some activities for a fun evening.

- Read entertaining math books together. Click here for a list of books: <u>https://dreme.stanford.edu/news/40-childrens-books-that-foster-a-love-of-math/</u>
- Card games that use basic math concepts like War (greater than/less than), Go Fish & Crazy 8s
- Online or printed books of logic puzzles such as Sodoku or Nonograms
- Toothpick problems are fun and easy google search "toothpick problems for kids"
- Board Games such as Candy Land, Sorry, Trouble, & Monopoly
- Play "I Spy" and describe objects by their geometric shape. For example, "I Spy a blue cylinder" so kids need to figure out it's the water bottle.
- Strengthen money concepts by having a Movie Night then have the kids "buy" their snacks and movie tickets using pennies, nickels, dimes, and quarters. Popcorn \$.38, ice cream \$1.20, Cost of Admission \$2.50, etc.
- Take Movie Night a step farther and have the kids make Drive in cars made of cardboard using measurement and shapes.
