## GRANTS

I've completed the MCLP and Title I Comprehensive-High School district. There was a hold up with MCLP due to the money not being in the egrants system to allocate, but it has been completed.

The Title I Comprehensive-Elementary district is not completed due to the funds are not yet in egrants for me to allocate. Since I have everything ready to go, once the funds are in the system I will give Stacy the budget break down for each School's innovative award they received through MCLP. I've been in contact with the necessary people to let them know the funds were not available.

Last month I reported that I had visited with Tara (OPI) that the 40K she guaranteed us for preschool wasn't enough for us and if she could give more. Well good news, we received an 100K + carryover which will help with the salaries of all the Pre-K staff. So MPDG is already set to go for next year. We will have to wait for our carry over (\$16019) which will be available on/after October 1<sup>st</sup>. This little bit extra will help defray the costs the district has to come up with.

### **District Committees**

The SBE committee was in full force starting June 3<sup>rd</sup> to June 13<sup>th</sup>. Since BES has implemented Guided math (this was their 3<sup>rd</sup> year), we decided to study and find out what guided math would look like in the other grades. Our goal was to have each school build their Guided Math framework to be proposed to their SLT at August Leadership Week (instructional planning).

KW/VC started Guided Math last year (when they observed BES) and again this year, so they were well on their way. The knowledge they gained was instrumental in the tweaks and modifications they need in order to get the most out of Guided Math.

Napi began observing BES this spring and the SBE time had greatly improved their knowledge and have a proposed framework.

BMS had a good framework to begin with, they just needed to add the small group component so instructional differentiation would happen.

BHS began to build a Guided Math framework with their EdReady intervention class. The goal being the other courses will collaborate together to build their frameworks.

BHA- has a framework that works with their multi-grade system and the knowledge gained will only increase their framework's effectiveness.

A Guided Math framework ensures that what one student receives in math is the same as any other in terms of content.

The K-6 had each built ELA frameworks with our new Wonders program.
