

Lakeview School District Community Survey Comment Analysis October 28, 2020

The Comment Analysis Summary is intended to identify and represent the prevailing themes collected through the comments gathered in the community survey. A major theme is identified as a result of having multiple participants referencing similar issues or concerns. Supporting comments are included verbatim within each theme.

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Respondents are extremely satisfied with the work of the school district.

The Lakeview School District could spend money more conservatively and realize that tax dollars should be used where they benefit the majority of students, aka not a turf football field.

Hard to justify approving a huge referendum without adding usable space.

Respondents identified many of the athletic projects as "wants" rather than "needs."

This should not be all in one. I would suggest a couple of different things; 1: the boosters should be covering the athletic department requests. 2. separate the actual academic needs out from the athletic needs, the athletic needs are not a necessity nor should they be paid for by local businesses and farmers.

There is no reason to turf the football field and spend 1.4 million dollars for 4 home games.

The community should be told how a turf field would be used for so many different things year-round vs grass. Why is it better if it's still MN winter? Also, didn't we just add an entire new gymnasium, bringing the total to 3, for phy ed use and year-round practice/games? You've got so much more than most area schools, it's starting to get greedy to continue to ask for more and expect referendums to pass. If Lakeview wants to be a good steward of the citizens' tax dollars, use those dollars for things that actually matter, not for certain persons who think it would make Lakeview stand out to have a turf field. We already have an amazing complex that area schools must come to because we have a track and several ball fields.

We feel we have the best extracurricular facilities in the whole area for a school our size. Thus the low ratings on some of the items listed.

Prioritize things that every student and community member benefits from versus just athletes who do not make up the majority of our student body or community. Turf for example seems like a want not a need. How often would PE really use it? How often would community really use it? It would mostly only benefit the football players which seems odd to me.

None of the above items listed are educating the Children. Most items listed are for the comfort of the fans. Turf on a Football field? Year-round practice in MN? Sounds like a very expensive project that won't get used much. What is the cost of the annual field maintenance?

Artificial turf on the football field in a school of 600-700 students in a town of 1,200 & 400 respectively. Really?! WOW. No offence but I think some folks are getting a little carrier away. BTW, I am in the process of selling my house and I had always assumed "having a good school would help sell it" not my experience. Focus on highest quality education you can get and focus on getting kids to get additional schooling after graduating. Please.

Again, I have no issue at all supporting the academic needs of the school, however that does not include the athletic wants of the school, please separate these out for the level.

Respondents expressed concerns regarding the cost of some of the projects and how it may impact taxes.

I would definitely support everything but the turf football field. I would need to see further justification for that expense, and would like to see the tax impact that removing that \$1.4mm would have. That's over 10% of the project for something that would be used maybe 8 times per year between football games and track meets.

I do not agree to these improvements with the current pandemic.

I think we need to really need to look at these and the cost associated with them. Are these realistic both from the project itself and the estimated costs? As a taxpayer, how much of my (and your) tax dollars should go to have a turf football field vs having good streets in Cottonwood that you and I drive on each day. We can have a really state of the art school with lots of goodies and a crappy looking community/city.

Some respondents requested additional information throughout the survey.

In order to make an informed decision as to my vote, I would need to understand more details of what exactly is wrong or needs to be repaired for the above listed top priorities. Renovate the locker rooms? What is wrong with what is there? Do the showers not work or is this cosmetic changes so they look nicer? Replace the auditorium curtains? Really? When people have lost their jobs to COVID, we have the lowest commodity prices in sometime, and high unemployment, we are worried about the how the curtains in the auditorium look?

We would need much more information about the items in the base plan. We are not knowledgeable about the condition of some of the other items listed. If the roof heating and ventilation system, exterior repair and parking lot repair are needed that must be done.

You will need to have detailed presentations in many formats (public, web, videos, paper, etc) to justify it to many of the farmers in the region who have been hurt by COVID and by our current political direction (tariffs, losing share in China etc). It does need to be done so that we can maintain our great school
