The immersion classrooms are working hard on learning their classroom prayer. Every morning the Kindergarten and 1st grade students smudge when they get to their classrooms. Each class is learning a prayer and about smudging. The BNAS teachers help with the teachings of smudging. Questions usually asked are, what is a smudge box, how do we smudge, what goes inside the smudge box, what is the meaning of the prayer. All these 5-7 year old students are learning the importance. At the end of the year all students will be able to share all about the smudge box and the importance of smudging.

During calendar time, each classroom is learning how to say each current month in Blackfeet. Along with days of the week, the different weather, seasons, numbers, and colors. Calendar time, the students enjoy singing and dancing as part of their learning. At each grade level we have the following number of students enrolled:




Aimsweb Early Literacy Kindergarten September Benchmarking 21-22





This is our second year using Aimsweb to measure literacy. Our Fall Tier distribution, T1 9%, T2 14%, and T3 77%, is about the same as it was last year at this time and comparable to the Tier distribution we saw when using Isip or other literacy measures. We feel like this is a typical starting place for us in kindergarten.

We will be conducting our first MTSS meeting the first week in October. At that time, teachers will analyze both Aimsweb subtest data as well as the Core Phonics Survey to identify both strengths and areas for growth for their students. We will develop our PDSA plans for T2 and T3 students and begin intervention October 11th.



Aimsweb Early Numeracy Kindergarten September Benchmarking 21–22




The kindergarten has used Aimsweb Numeracy for benchmarking math for over 20 years. For the past 6 years, that data has been stored digitally in Aimsweb. Looking back, we can generalize that 10% or less of our students enter kindergarten in Tier 1. This year, our Tier 1 is entering at 22%. (The only other time our students entered around 22% Tier 1, our Spring outcomes were great, 62% Tier 1.) Based on the data, we're optimistic that this class of students will have amazing outcomes!

During our next math meeting, this data will be shared out with teachers and our goals for January and May will be set.

1st Grade Fall Benchmarking Data



Our focus in the first month of school has been to get a solid Tier 1 program in place for all students in all content areas. Using our Early Literacy Fall Benchmark data, Core Phonics Survey data, and Phonological Awareness Survey Test (P.A.S.T) data, the 1st grade team held their first MTSS meeting this past week to place our students into their Tier 2 Small Group Interventions. Due to Covid-19, we are unable to group like students from separate classes together for this intervention, and therefore we can not run our traditional intervention model, but we are going to run a model that meets the needs of all students as best we can.

The First Grade Team has accomplished a lot this month. We completed our Aimsweb Fall Benchmark for most of our students at Vina. We were excited to have our first MTSS meeting for this year and it went great. It was very informative in helping us help our students to be successful.

We also had our very first field trip to Running Eagle Falls and it was amazing. The students loved being able to go and learn outside of the classroom. Vina is implementing a monthly theme in our authentic literacy plan.

The students have been learning about citizens in the community and school. Our project based learning activity to wrap up this month's theme was having members of the community join us outside for learning stations so the students can relate what they have learned in the classroom to real life connections.

Blending words and rote counting were strengths. Letter recognition and number recognition were weaknesses in all 3 classes. PreK completed our OWL unit learning about Friends. We learned about what friends are, how friends help each other, and how friends work and play together. The last week in September we started a unit on "Families". We will continue this unit in October. On September 24th, we took a walking field trip to the Plains Indian Museum in honor of Native American Week.
