Idaho Opportunity Scholarship:

Recognizing the need for a well-educated workforce, Governor C.L. "Butch" Otter and the Idaho Legislature established the Opportunity Scholarship to remove barriers to higher education and prepare college/university graduates to enter the workforce. The Opportunity Scholarship awards eligible applicants up to \$3,500 per year and is renewable for up to four years.

The scholarship funds are available per school year; recipients must re-apply each year and are eligible to receive the scholarship for a maximum of four years.

Eligibility:

To qualify for the scholarship, a student must meet *all* of the following criteria:

- Have an unweighted, cumulative GPA of 3.0 or above
- Be an Idaho resident
- Be a graduate from an **Idaho high school** or its equivalent (GED/HSE from Idaho)
- Complete the State Board of Education scholarship application by March 1
- Complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (**FAFSA**) by March 1
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress for financial aid purposes.

GEAR UP Scholarship:

To qualify for the GEAR UP scholarship, a student must meet all of the following criteria:

The GEAR UP Idaho Scholarship is available to students who participated in the GEAR UP program and graduated high school (or its equivalent) in 2012, 2013, and 2014.



- Applicants must be less than 22 years old at the time they receive their first scholarship award.
- Applicants must possess a secondary school diploma or its recognized equivalent.
- Applicants must have completed and submitted the initial scholarship application prior to graduating from high school.
- Applicants must have completed and submitted the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA). The FAFSA priority deadline was on or before February 15 of the student's graduation year.
- Applicants must be enrolled or accepted for full-time enrollment in a program of undergraduate instruction at an eligible institution of higher education that is located within Idaho's boundaries. Accepted institutions include any Idaho public regionally accredited institution under the general supervision and governance of the Idaho State Board of Education, and any private, non-profit, regionally accredited institution, as listed below.

A Special Thanks to S.I.L.O.

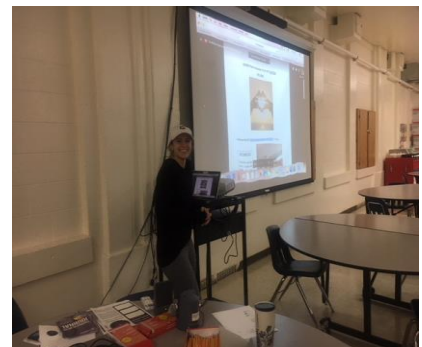
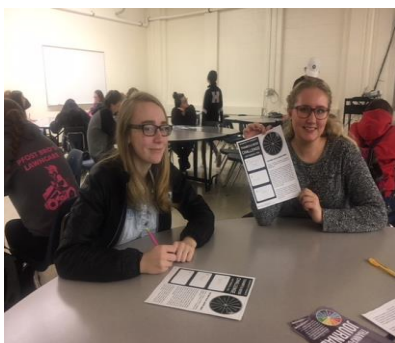

S.O.S. Thankfulness Challenge Week: November 13th-16th Sources of Strength Sponsored a Thankfulness campaign. Sources of Strength president Nallely Gonzalez and vice president Ember Christensen did a presentation with HHS students during advisory highlighting the power of being thankful and expressing gratitude to others. They



showed a video demonstrating how being grateful not only helps the person receiving the encouraging message, but improves the happiness of the person expressing their gratitude. Students were encouraged to write a thank you card to a trusted adult who had made a positive difference in their lives. Brain research has found that a person who makes a conscious effort to think about three things that they are grateful for each day for 21 days can change their brain chemistry to create more feelings of well-being and to help them have a more positive outlook. Students were given a Thankfulness Journal to chronicle three things they were thankful for the next 21 days.



Sources of Strength Booster Training at Homedale Middle School November 13th:

On Monday November 13th, Homedale High School S.O.S. peer leaders Alicia Raine, Nallely Gonzalez, Rylan Hall and Wyatt James and Suicide Prevention Action Network Trainer Mrs. Debbie Flaming went to the middle school to conduct the S.O.S. booster training. Ms. Topmiller, the new middle school counselor plans to continue the program for the 2017-18 school year. 35 students middle school students attended the training along with six adult advisers. Students learned about impacting the school with positive messages, the importance of having a relationship with a trusted adult. The training ended with students choosing an adult advisor and planning with a team of fellow student's, campaigns to spread messages of Hope, Help & Strength throughout the school and community. 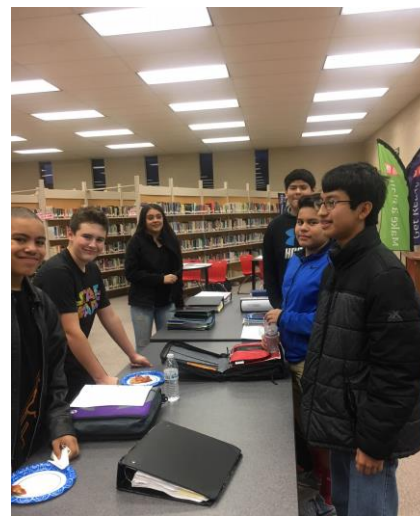

The middle school and high school AVID students, instructors and counselors sponsored a parent night to showcase what AVID is all about. At the event a pizza dinner was served followed by stations set up for parents and younger siblings to visit and experience AVID activities.

It is estimated that by the year 2020, two-thirds of all jobs will require some level of postsecondary education. AVID prepares students for 21st century careers each day by providing the academic and behavioral skills necessary to succeed in the workplace. Organization, time management, critical thinking, collaboration, and problem-solving are strong components of the AVID System. AVID includes career exploration in its secondary



curriculum. For the 2017-18 school year, Homedale High School will have three AVID classes. One class for freshmen, sophomores and juniors. AVID, Advancement Via Individual Determination, is a global nonprofit organization dedicated to closing the achievement gap by preparing all students for college and other postsecondary opportunities.
