Council Statement of Purpose

Dressed to Learn provides comfy school clothes for any LISD students in need. How many students do we serve? Over 13,500 LISD students are enrolled in the National School Lunch Program (NSLP) and over 1,000 students are designated McKinney-Vento (unhoused). We have seen an almost 50% jump in need for the 2024 Back to School season. We served over 1,500 students in 2023-24.

A student's basic needs are food, shelter/housing and clothing. Clothing needs can be perceived as a short-term fix, prioritized behind housing and food for our client families in need. Children are always growing, but it's hard for students to focus on learning when their clothes and shoes don't fit. Dressed to Learn fills the gap.
