Fall iReady Diagnostic We are really excited about our approach to the Fall iReady diagnostic this year. THIS year, we are putting an increased emphasis on starting where the students left off last year. In previous years, it appears that students didn't do well on their fall diagnostic, which let to repeated lessons from previous years. We are really looking forward to starting students in 24-25 where they left off in 23-24. We hope that this will lead to increased growth AND performance for our WRE Scholars.

WRE focuses on Staff Culture We are super focused again this year on staff culture at WRE. We have a team of folks (called the sunshine committee) that recognizes birthdays and staff celebrations (like new babies!). We have an employee of the month (that comes with a special parking spot). We also have added staff social activities, led by our staff culture expert (she doesn't know that she has that title, I just gave it to her while writing this Board Report) Tiffany Locey. Mrs. Locey has organized Pedicures (Yes- this principal received his first pedi in August this year, with staff), escape rooms, dinners and lunches, and even staff trips to yard sales! It has been a really good thing for WRE staff!

Our building focus this year is: Collaboration and Explicit Instruction. (We are also going to continue to focus on Science of Reading and Classroom Management, which is important stuff too!). All staff will be trained to go through Acadience Screener and then subsequent students support and lessons to ensure all kids can READ. We are focused on Collaboration in Grade Level Teams. Finally, as part of Dr. Rhonda Fritz's PD training last year, and Dr. Tricia Berg's training THIS year, we will be focused on Explicit instruction.

Essentially (this is a gross oversimplification) explicit instruction is letting students know what they are going to learn, BEFORE they learn it. Additionally, using the gradual Release Model of Direct Instruction, and using formative assessments to drive student engagement will help students LEARN more! All of these focuses are high-yield instructional strategies and supported by TONS of educational research. High-Yield Instructional strategies are considered high-yield if they produce MORE than one year's growth in one year's time.

CHAMPS Conference / Training

Just before students came to school on the first day, our Licensed staff participated in the CHAMPS conference held at the Port of Morrow. This training was a tremendous success, allowing teachers to "deep dive" into classroom management strategies. The conference provided valuable insights into effective strategies and protocols that can be implemented immediately to build and encourage a positive and productive learning environment. We are confident that this training and the continued training to come, will contribute significantly to our continued success in managing and supporting student behavior.

First Week Success

Our first week of school was a successful one, thanks to the collective efforts of our dedicated staff, students, and parents. The positive energy and enthusiasm have set a strong tone for the year ahead. Our new students and incoming 4th grade class have seamlessly integrated into our school community, and our returning students have adjusted

smoothly to the new academic year. This year, to start our students out in the morning we are serving breakfast from the cafeteria rather than delivering packaged meals in the hallways as students arrive. Our kitchen coordinator is eager to be able to offer more hot and cold choices and our students are excited for the additional options.

New Staff and Teaching Assignments

This year, we welcomed two new teachers and adjusted some teaching assignments to meet our students' needs. Our new staff members bring a wealth of experience to our team, and we are excited about the contributions they will make. Rebecca Lauer is our new ELD teacher and Bonnie Olney is our new 6th grade teacher. Both have prior teaching experience within the school setting. Rebecca was teaching on the west side of the state, in a multi-lingual classroom. She is a perfect fit for students learning a new language and assimilating to a new culture.

Jackie Bulow has filled our Special Education classroom teacher position and is working diligently to continue the work that has been done. Jackie was formerly a 5th grade teacher here at IES.

To that, I will add that this is my first year at Irrigon Elementary and Morrow County School District. District staff as well as my building staff have been incredibly supportive and I am so appreciative of the opportunity to serve our staff, students, and families in this role.

Academic and Instructional Goals

We are on our way with the iReady diagnostic assessment to gain insights into student abilities and identify areas of need. This data will play a crucial role in guiding our instructional strategies and tailoring our teaching methods to better support each student's learning.

In addition, we have begun implementing Acadience this fall as a critical tool for assessing student phonics and fluency ability. This assessment will provide the necessary data for students below grade level, as to how well our students are performing in reading accuracy and fluency, and how we can best support those who are working towards grade-level expectations. By integrating Acadience into our assessment practices, it will provide us with direction in our reading instruction and provide targeted support where it is needed most.

Upcoming Events

One of the exciting events on the horizon is our 6th grade students' trip to Outdoor School during the first week of October. This experience promises to be both educational and enjoyable, offering our students unique opportunities to learn outside the traditional classroom setting. Our 6th grade team is diligently planning and organizing logistics to ensure that this trip is a success and that it provides meaningful educational benefits for all participating students.

I am confident that the CHAMPS, Acadience, and ongoing targeted support initiatives that are in place, along with the ongoing dedication of our staff, will drive our success and positively impact our students' educational experiences. I look forward to sharing further updates and celebrating our achievements in the months ahead.

Heppner Elementary School


For Heppner Elementary School, the year is off to a fantastic start! The Friday before students arrived, MCSD elementary teachers worked with Tricia Berg to focus on the importance of routines and procedures. Teachers took this work into their classrooms on Monday, and spent intentional time teaching students the routines and expectations for each part of their day. When expectations are present, students live up to them and thrive.

As I walked around during the 1st week of school, I saw a variety of ways these concepts were presented to students. As a unique k-6 school, the developmentally appropriate way to introduce expectations varies. In 6th grade, Mr. Rosen worked with the class to identify what was meaningful for them, creating a list of what they want their classroom to look like and sound like under the general rules of Be Respectful, Solve Problems, and Make Good Decisions. Students collaborated and signed their work, holding them accountable to each other.

Mrs. Chelsea Matheny in 2nd grade listed every routine she was going to teach students on a paper, and checked them off as they went through. Students would clap and cheer that they were a step closer to being successful in the classroom.

Mrs. Piper in the resource room has a CHAMPS centered display of what small group and independent learning looks like in her classroom, including noise levels, how to ask for help, what movement is okay, how they can participate, and what success looks like.

The professional development offered by the district was taken to heart by the teachers of HES that want their students and their classrooms to be calm, safe spaces where students can thrive!
